The CCDV racers have, I believe, proven to be force that can't be overlooked in competition. With outstanding performances from Al Betz and Ellis Gray and now Joe Signore winning it all on the July 10<sup>th</sup> Challenge we have come of age!

With a small but potent arsenal of competitors, Al, Joe, Ellis, Neil, Bob, Richy, and myself, (Edgar are you in?) with Rose again pitching in driving the tire truck and torquing the lug nuts, we hit the gates of E-town looking to take home some serious points and trophies. Several of us decided to run the GM EFI series as well as the Challenge because of the long wait for time shots. Ellis was back to his old self, running his numbers and cutting good lights. Neil's Z06 was running great even with a clutch that was not up to handling the power his car was putting out. Neil was "informed" on his second time shot that the track would not allow him to run sub 12's without a roll cage. He had run an 11.83 on his first time run.

After round one of the Challenge we had all but Bob Rosenberg going into the second round. He had to run against Al Betz in the first round and lost. I had to run against Dan Swadis, a tough competitor and also a former member of CCDV. I tree'd him and ran a better number than he did and won by .109 seconds. Close race. In the EFI races Neil, El and I got into the second round. I don't know if it was the intimidation factor but most of the people we ran against were off their dial-ins by more than a second. Round two had all but one of the Vettes that staged in round one and I went out when I hammered the tree then played around too much on the big end. I thought I was on a breakout run and hit the brakes a little too soon and lost. The big winner of that event was a Vette who also competes in the Challenge.

Back to the Challenge, where Richy, Al, Neil, and I all went out in the second by either breaking out, not so bad or Red lighting, what we all hate to do. El and Joe were still in it. El had to run John Mackey, who's a long time racer, and went red by .003, oh so close. Joe was running his numbers all day and hitting the tree hard with some great R/T's. After the smoke had cleared there were only two guys left in the Challenge, John Mackey, the serious racer, and runner-up for "Rookie of the Year" last year, our very own Joe Signore. Both racers had good burnouts and Joe's looked especially good. With tires heated, they lined up at the tree and waited for the ambers to come on. Joe left first on a 12.90 dial in while Mackey had to wait it out on his 12.21. Joe's better light, a .063 versus John's .163 meant Joe just had to run closer to his dial in to win, and win he did. Joe ran a 12.92 while John's 12.25 was close but not enough to overtake the advantage John gave it to Joe at the tree. What a great race. Congrats to Joe on his win and all the racers who came out!

In the Club Challenge the CCDV again finds itself in the lead with an 80 to 45 advantage over the County Corvette Association. There are still five races left so it's not in the bag yet. Al Conners had been doing an excellent job of recruiting members from his club and also by winning rounds to get points for his team. I'm looking for tighter second half from the CCA.

ECS Corvette Challenge dates: Aug. 7<sup>th</sup> 3:00 pm. The Vette Magazine Show and Go is taking place in the morning of the 7<sup>th</sup>, so it's going to be a full day of racing and Corvettes. Make plans to come join us! Sept. 4<sup>th</sup> is the next CC and also the next Quick 8 shootout. Last time we had a C4 run 8.82 at 159 mph in the quarter mile. It was a thrill to see Vettes run that quickly. Till next time.

# CCDV MEMBERS WILL WALK 50 MILES IN THREE DAYS TO HELP FIGHT MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS

I have signed up once again and Sue is joining me this year to walk 50 miles in three days to raise funds and awareness about multiple sclerosis during the National MS Society's Challenge Walk II, October 8-10, 2004.

My oldest sister died a few years ago from MS, I have a co-worker who has MS and we know that this devastating and debilitating disease has affected other CCDV members. The local chapters provide support and programs that greatly assist people with the disease.

The Challenge Walk begins on Friday morning, October 8<sup>th</sup> at the Philadelphia Art Museum. Following the opening ceremonies, walkers will once again trek along Kelly Drive and through Manayunk to historic Valley Forge Park. After an overnight stay at Camp Green Lane in Harleysville, participants will walk through scenic Montgomery County on day two and then finish their adventure in center city Philadelphia on day three. The Challenge Walk ends with a visit to the Battleship New Jersey and an Olympic-style closing ceremony at Campbell's Field in Camden, NJ, where family and friends are encouraged to attend.

Challenge Walkers must each raise at least \$1,500 to participate in the event. Making an on-line pledge is very easy. Access <a href="www.walk4ms.org">www.walk4ms.org</a> – click on MS "Challenge" Walk, and then E-pledge or you can send your check to Joel and Sue, payable to National MS Society at: 9208 Lansford St., Philadelphia, PA 19114.

For years, no treatments were available for MS symptoms, but today, thanks to funds raised through similar events, the FDA has recently approved several treatments that may alter the underlying course of multiple sclerosis. Early diagnosis and treatment remains critically important.

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

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

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

# DON'T MISS THE NEXT ONE

The Drive-In and Dinner was the perfect day. The weather was great. I guess this officially lifts the rain curse off me, right? The eight of us all in Corvettes, a C2, a C3, three C4s and three C5s arrived at the Berlinsville Hotel for dinner. Dinner and was a blast.

The Hotel is steeped in history, the land it's built on land that originally belonged to William Penn. In the early 1700s Penn's son, Thomas, gave the land to Richard Peters along with the hotel, which was only a Tavern back then. In 1761 the Tavern was enlarged to include an Inn. A direct descendent of the Mayflower, Sarah Washborn, died in this Inn. It has survived Indian uprisings in 1740. It became a farmhouse in the 1850s and a doctor's office in the early 1920s. During prohibition it was a speakeasy. The Berlinsville Hotel has been owned and operated by Mike and Gloria Kravetz since 1951. Gloria has the kind of outgoing personality that makes you not forget her at 74 years young; she is the chef, cook and bottle washer.
