

On Tuesday, December 2, 2003, Dennis Trayes and I were once again invited by the Sunshine Foundation and honored to assist with another one day Dreamlift from the Atlantic City Airport to Walt Disney World in Orlando, Fla.

This time there were several wheelchair bound children. I estimate there were about 70 to 80 children (at least half in wheelchairs) and perhaps 40 to 50 caretakers (nurses, assistants, lifters & Sunshine organizers). Five NJ State Police Officers were also invited as lifters at the last minute because a few children were not able to make the trip.

Besides carrying or assisting all the needy children along with their wheelchairs or other equipment on and off the planes and buses, etc., Dennis and I had the privilege of escorting Ian and Shane, two young boys with cerebral palsy throughout the park. Although they could not communicate or care for themselves, they were a joy to be with and made a day full of hard work a sheer pleasure! You could tell by their great smiles and shrieks that they thoroughly enjoyed the experience. Plus, the sunny mid-70 degree temperature made for a perfect day at Disney!

We are hopeful that the Sunshine Foundation we will continue to keep us as regular helpers in the future. The airlifts are proof that our CCDV donations are put to good use. If we could ever manage to come up with \$50,000+, we could sponsor an entire Dreamlift on our own. Something to think about!?!

PS: CCDV also helped in providing the goodie bags that were given out to all the children.



Buying Tires at Eppies by Jim Neelans

For eight years I looked at my 1966 Corvette Coupe with hubcaps before I finally decided it was time for an upgrade. I did some research and ordered a set of aluminum knock-off wheels from Eckler's, but there was still the matter of the tires. I spoke with Ellis Gray and read a few reviews on the Internet before I decided to go to Eppies in Northeast Philadelphia where I saw Jay. I wanted to keep the better ride and steering so I ordered the Coker Classic Goldline Radials. They were delivered in October, but I was very disappointed because the line was more orange than gold. Don Lemek said I'd look like I was driving around on a set of Halloween pumpkins! I sent the tires back and replaced them with a set of Firestone Goldline bias-ply tires. When they came in, I took the knock-off rims down to Eppies to have the tires mounted. First, the tire changers put the rims on the Hunter TC3500 Touchless machine and mounted the tires and then proceeded to balance them. As all of this was going on, I noticed one of the tire changers was writing RR, LR, RF and LF on the inside of the tires. Now, I know they didn't have directional tires back in 1966, so I asked him what he was doing. He told me at Eppies they take the lowest weighted tires and put them on the front and the heaviest go on the rear. The reason for this is because with bias-ply and radial tires, lower weighted tires up front mean the tire and rim are a better match and will give better tire wear and handling.

I would recommend Eppies to anyone in our club. When I wasn't pleased with my original order, they were very accommodating and did everything they could to make sure that I would be

satisfied with my tires. I've owned a lot of cars in my 40 years of driving and bought countless sets of tires and all of the tire changers just put the tires on any position on the car, but not at Eppies. The store is always busy, but the service is well worth the wait. Be sure to ask for Jay, and let him know you're from CCDV. Jim






