Rose drove the tire truck, cheered us on, and lent a hand wherever it was needed. With a $2-\frac{1}{2}$ hour delay while the track officials dried and prepped the track we had lots of time to change tires and bench race. El and Neil were running the Challenge and the GM EFI series that was going on today. El's car was running pretty consistent 12.2's all day and Neil's Z was cranking out 12.4's most of his time shots. Al was "on" all day and John was introduced to the new LED's and was getting use to them. Ken Lynch ran 1 time shot, he knows his car and that was all he needed to dial in. Bob Rosenberg was using his newly found launch technique to get his car down were it belongs, time wise. Don Terranova signed up for points and we added yet another racer to the team. I know no one has ever found motor oil in human veins, but I have to wonder as technology advances in DNA testing, will they discover a "car" gene in certain individuals. Stan Fisher would certainly be a smart choice for the trials. He is a self proclaimed car nut who as a child often drove his parents crazy by successfully identifying make and model with as little as a taillight. This craze was fueled by visits to his grandparents in Tampa where he would hang around Don Garlits' Speed Shop.

Stan having his very own wheels began with a '57 Ford, which required him to sell his entire slot car collection in order to make the first insurance payment. However, the thrill was over in two hours, when he was broad sided and the sting of it all left him uninterested in driving again. Having tickets for the Daytona 500 that year worked well. While in Florida, the car became available and the Fishers had their Vette! Unfortunately, it became a bittersweet trip after witnessing Dale Earnhardt's fatal crash.

Stan and Maryann had their '67 shipped home and it arrived safely on a huge tractor-trailer with three feet of snow predicted in the forecast. Future plans include a list of mechanical changes to its original engine and then the body freshened with new paint.

As for personal taste, Stan likes all Corvettes, but favors the mid-years in blue and with a convertible top. He feels he has been trusted with a piece of automotive history and it's his job to preserve that history. He finds some of the C1's absolutely stunning. Stan likes to enjoy and drive with little worry of winning competitions. He prefers to look at the car as a nice example of a Corvette and displays it for the Lansdale and Hatboro shows (special towns for both of them). Despite his demanding work schedule and the frustration of missing events, being a club member has been wonderful. It has offered fun outings, lots of nice people and good friendships. He also loves the connection his car makes with strangers and a common interest shared. Great times are spur of the moment gatherings on a beautiful day with the top down, a soft breeze and the shade of trees overhead.

I asked Stan what thoughts come to mind when the word Corvette is spoken. He answered, "Unique styling, performance and handling. It's a car that gets better all the time."
