CREATE YOUR OWN RALLY IN 700 EASY STEPS by Don Terranova

I'd like to describe the process of putting together a Road Rally, you may find this interesting. First you must have a general idea as to where you want to run it. Then look at a map to plan a basic route. You then run that route only to find that half the roads are not Corvette friendly, i.e. gravel or full of pot holes or they may not be open. So then you drive aimlessly trying to find the right route, after 3 afternoons and 2 tanks of gas you finally find it. Then you go back to look for clues to put in the booklet. This is not as easy as it seems. Because you want to run the rally in a rural setting and not many clues are available except for the occasional sign, a goofy mailbox etc... anyhow you find about 40 clues. At about this point you feel as if you're home free. You run the course 2 more times to take exact mileage readings, by now the Exxon dealer has you on his Christmas list and the residents in the neighborhood are convinced you're casing the houses for a burglary. Then you sit down at your PC and create an easy to follow Rally Booklet in about 12 hours. The worst part of this is wording the questions; you don't want to make them too easy, but also careful to not make them too vague. So there you have it, you're finished. You print out a completed booklet and you are reviewing it while watching TV, you hear the local newscaster reporting on a bridge closure in your area you realize it's one on your Rally. The next weekend you hop in your car and redo that portion of the Rally which means removing the bridge from the course, finding a alternate route that is Corvette friendly, recalculate all your mileage and finding some new clues. Then you need to run the course complete again as sort of a dress rehearsal. You sit back down at the PC that you've grown to hate by now; you put a blank tape in the VCR to record CSI and start revising the booklet. Again, you're done. It's a week before the Rally and you think it's safe to print out all the booklets, right? What can happen now? You create a map that the rally participants can open to find their way back in case they get lost. You put everything in a box, close the lid, take it downstairs and as you are putting it on the kitchen table, your wife says to you as she's watching the news, "Hey look at all the flooding from that last hurricane, and some roads close by are flooded". You think, "NO WAY", but "YES WAY" you go back 10 steps and do it all over again. You start to print the booklets right after dinner and then your printer displays a message "WARNING BLACK INK CARTRIDGE LOW". You put a blank tape in the VCR to record NYPD BLUE, find a Staples that is open and make the trip. Finally you're done you run the course the day before the Rally just to make sure nothing has changed, it hasn't, and you're gold. Now all you need to do is promote it, setup a meeting point, get the OK from the town or township, get coffee and doughnuts, hold a instruction meeting, find volunteers to man the checkpoints, organize the Poker Run, record mileages, make sure everyone departs at the correct time. After everyone leaves you clean up the meeting point, hop in your car and hightail to the finish point before the first car out gets there. Then you make sure everyone returns, correct the booklets, pick the winner for the rally and poker run. Then you go home to watch CSI and NYPD BLUE. That's all there is to it, what's all the fuss about. Hey Paul and Ginny, I did say thanks didn't I?

Attention Rally Participants by Don Terranova

We are going to bump it up a notch. The last 3 Rallys were a big success; however I think we are ready for a change and a bit more of a challenge. What am I talking about? Next Spring our Rally format will change, instead of following a set of directions that lead you to each turn by watching your odometer, while looking for clues along the way. You will need to find clues to find your way. Let me give you an example.

A clue may read as follows;

A little bit of green and a whole lot of white after passing my pickets you better turn right. Explanation: turn right after you pass a large white house with green shutters and a picket fence.

I believe we are ready for this type of Rally. Most people are able to find many of the clues and if we eliminate the need to watch the odometer both driver and navigator can search for clues. The glitch is, if you miss the clue you miss the turn. Don't worry, we will include after every turn a warning such as, "if you pass the First Church of Lost Travelers', you've gone too far". We don't want you to go too far off course. There <u>will</u> be more backtracking. I think this will be a lot more interesting as well as challenging. If you have become comfortable with the present way we run the Rally please do not be alarmed, I can guarantee you'll like this and I haven't lied to you yet.
