It was dry, sunny and hot for this our 4th race of the East Coast Supercharging Corvette Challenge. Did I mention it was also Hot! Heading out to do battle were Al, Lee, Neil, Joel, Glenn, Doug, and meeting us at the track was Jerry and Rob. Bob Rosenberg, Gas Cap editor, also came out to try his hand at racing again. First round saw several CCDV members lining up against each other. Doug fell to Al when Doug was hard on the brakes at the big end and still broke out. Al was on a slow run and his car had very little left to catch up with Doug's slower car. Joel and I had to pair off and I just caught Joel in the traps to beat him, it was a very close race. Going into round two were Al, Glenn, Rob and myself. Al got beat in round two but the rest of us went on to the third round. I got knocked out in the third round and Glenn in the fourth but Rob continued to roll through the competition to become the big winner of the day! Rob did a great job of running and dialing his car in on a really difficult day. Congrats to Rob.

Rose was driving truck, helping with tires and being the "Mother Duck", making sure we all were keeping cool and getting lots of liquids in us. Vince came along for the ride with me and assured me that his car will be ready to "Rock & Roll" in the not to distant future. Jim Kovitch won CCDV's "Closest to dial in the first round" plaque and tech card.

Also running in the heat were the Pro 8 cars. It is very impressive to see these guys run their cars in the 8-9 and 10 second bracket. The event winner Paul Ziajski, running a twin turbo C5, took top honors in that series for the day. He was turning 9.4-9.5's all day.

In the last two races I went to, I witnessed two unfortunate accidents. The first was during the US Muscle Car series race. A C5 started to veer off the track when his car hit second gear. He was driving an automatic. He hit the wall, then it looked like he over compensated and his car came around and hit the other wall. Major damage was done to his car but he was OK. The second happened at this last Challenge when a racer was moving his car up a little to make room for a fellow racer to get out of line to run in the Pro 8. His car lurched forward and struck the back of another C5, which pushed into the back of a third C5. There were two racers that were standing between the second Vette and the third and their legs got pinned between the two cars. One of the racers was OK but the second had to be transported to the hospital to get checked out. Those of us that saw the accident thought the gentleman had at the minimum a broken leg, but it turned out to be "just" muscle trauma and he'll be back racing in a few weeks. Had it not been for the rubber bumpers it could have been a lot worse. The lesson that should be learned in the first instance is that if your car starts to lose traction and the back is coming around on you get off the throttle. You cannot win drag races going sideways. The second is that you have to be aware of what is going on around you in the staging lanes. Racing is fun and relatively safe, but it's up to the racers to know their cars.

Thanks to all the racers and supporters that came out on a really hot day. The July Challenge dates are July 9th, 23rd & 30th. The 9th & 30th are morning sessions and we'll be leaving from Bennigans, which is located just north of the PA Willow Grove turnpike entrance, at 7:40AM. July 23rd is an afternoon event. We will leave from Bennigans at 1:40 PM. Come out and race or just hang with us. Cost to race is \$30 and to watch is \$10. Oh and bring some sunscreen too!

Corvette Owners Alert

It is important that every automobile hobbyist is aware of proposed legislation and contacts the Pennsylvania House Transportation Committee members who are considering legislation which, if passed, will have a major impact on the majority of automobile enthusiasts.

Several states have passed or are considering legislation which place restrictions on exhausts, wheels and limits on lowering cars. At this time Pennsylvania legislators are considering restricting exhaust systems to the factory installed muffler or specifications (H.B. 1330). Many CCDV members have replaced the stock exhaust with systems that will fail state inspection if H.B. 1330 becomes law. It is important that we contact members of the Pennsylvania House Transportation Committee immediately and to request their opposition to H.B. 1330.

Below is a list of e-mails for Pennsylvania House Transportation Committee member we urge you to contact and send them this message:

Please consider the following facts prior to your vote on H.B. 1330:

- H.B. 1330 ignores the fact that aftermarket exhaust systems are designed to make vehicles run more efficiently without increasing emissions.
- H.B. 1330 fails to recognize that aftermarket exhaust systems offer increased performance and utility.
- H.B. 1330 would make it nearly impossible for hobbyists to replace factory exhaust systems with more durable, better performing options.
- H.B. 1330 perpetuates the erroneous assumption that enthusiasts who equip their vehicles with modified exhaust systems are involved in illegal street racing.

Mike Burke, past CCDV President and friend to all passed away on June 17th, 2005. Mike was the driving force that kept CCDV together and was the main reason that I became active in our club. Mike was always ready to help anyone who had a legal question, problem with a camera or where the Rolling Stones were playing next. Mike, Maureen, and Nicki were always a big part of my CCDV "family" and I'll miss Mike. Below is a small biography of Mike, but as Joel and I know, there was so much more to Mike than these few words. Every time I hear a Stones' song it will be Mike talking to me...

Bill Burkholder, Chairman of the Board, Past President (2003-2004)

Mike joined CCDV in June 1990. He was on the CCDV Board for many years as well as the Club's public relations contact and photographer. Mike attended most Club activities, was very active in the Cavalcade, was CCDV president for 2 years in 1998 and 1999 and was Chairman of the Board in 2000.

Mike organized several unique and popular CCDV activities, including caravans to the Pennsylvania Renaissance Faire and Edgar Allen Poe readings in Lancaster, dinners at the Mansion in Harrisburg, the Corvette Club Classics at Philadelphia Race Track in Bensalem, participation in the Willow Grove Loyalty Day Parades in support of the Willow Grove VFW, the Doylestown Parade in support of Bucks County Fireman's 100th Anniversary as well as may other worthwhile events.

In April, 1997, Mike was very instrumental in supporting Ellis Gray in the creation of the CCDV web site. He was also a strong supporter and a founding member of the National Corvette Museum.

In September 1992 when Mike married Maureen, he requested a Corvette entourage to deliver them to the wedding. The procession was attended by many Club members. It was quite an impressive sight; their outdoor ceremony at Curtis Hall Arboretum with our Vettes as a backdrop.

Mike was very intelligent and was a teacher before becoming an attorney. Mike and Maureen traveled to Russia to adopt their son Nickolai when he was about 3 years old. Nicki brought joy and happiness into their lives.

Mike was an avid Rolling Stones fan and traveled the world to attend their concerts. He held a gala pig roast party every year on Mick Jagger's birthday!

Mike and Maureen originally owned a 1988 Sapphire Blue Corvette. Later they purchased a 1965 Maroon Convertible and then a 1969 Black 427.

Mike was a good friend who will be missed by all who knew him!
