On the evening of Tuesday, April 5th Steve and I had a pleasant visit with Glenn Murphy as I interviewed him for the following article. It was a great night with shared laughter, stories and excitement for upcoming club events. I wrote the article, received Glenn's approval and submitted it to Bob Rosenberg. In less than one week from that night, Glenn's daughter, Linda was killed in a tragic accident. A beautiful young woman with a bright future, giving her best and loved by many of all ages and walks. Someone loved as deeply as any father can and one who was and is so very proud of her Daddy.

I feel honored to be associated with CCDV members not because of their cars, but of the human quality I see in each and every member. The outpouring for Glenn and his family is stellar and we are a group who openly weep for one another. Glenn, our words are inadequate, but our hearts offer you our support, our prayers and our love.

I continue to be surprised by the reaction I get from those I ask to interview. Most feel there is very little to say and yet to me it's like finding nuggets of memories, thoughts and emotions that in the end always weave themselves in to a story. We all have a story worth hearing and so does Glenn Murphy.

With great affection, Glenn told me how his father was the first to introduce him to the love of cars. He and Dad started going to the drag races together at ATCO when Glenn was only 9 years old. On one of those father-son outings a few years later, Glenn spotted a '63 split window coupe sitting in the parking lot. Catching a glimpse of a Corvette was rare in those days and this first look completely won him over. His Corvette fever became so great by age14, Glenn and his childhood buddy, Bob, would risk riding their bikes from home near Grant and Bustleton in NE Philadelphia to visit the showroom at Norton Chevy on Rising Sun Avenue near Cottman! These secret trips through busy traffic were for the sheer pleasure of walking among brand new and shiny Vettes without parents or time restraints. To this day, Glenn fears his father's reaction at discovering the chance he and Bob took in those days.

Older brother, Rob, purchased a '54 Corvette and kept it for only a few months before leaving for school, but the brief time offered this younger brother his very first ride. Later, Glenn owned a 1970 and a new '72 Mach I Mustang, but they still weren't that Vette. In 1999 when he could now afford to carelessly spend a few dollars he began saving for his must have car. His confidence and determination were visible by the license plate on his Chevy Cavalier that read, *02 Vette*. It was a plate he sported from March 2001 until September of that year. Those days in between made him the subject of humor and being called a dreamer by by-passers or those waiting for the light to change. Finally, when 9/11/2001 produced zero financing even on Corvettes, the comical license took its proper place. He purchased a beautiful 2002 Electron Blue coupe from Kerbeck. Glenn added a front spoiler as well as a rear spoiler to customize this eye-catching car himself. Chrome wheels and new tires have replaced stock, along with European taillights and Z06 rear brake ducts. Very near future plans include headers and other professional engine changes.

When asked, what comes to mind when you hear the word, Corvette, Glenn instantly responded with "My car sitting in my garage." It must seem like those bike rides, long getting there, but well worth the journey. To everyone in my CCDV family, I want to thank you all for your encouragement, heartfelt sorrow and condolences through this hardest time of my life.

Linda was the love of my life and still is and always will be. She was "Daddy's Little Girl" in every sense of the expression. I was a very fortunate father that my daughter was so close to me and she loved me too as I did her. I was so very proud of Linda as she was doing all she could to help others. She was a nurse at Saint Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, she coached and taught cheerleading to 2 young teams in Bensalem and she touched everyone she met in an extremely special and very good way. Linda was also about to start as a sophomore at Temple University in September to go for her Registered Nurse degree.

I want to thank you ALL of CCDV for your support. I feel like more than just a member of a club here, I feel like part of a family. YOU ALL make me feel that way.
