The top points leader, John Hadyniak has a 2 point lead going into the 8th race over Ralph Savarese who has a 2 point lead over Chris Young who has a 2 point lead over Rob Farley. It is going to be a great ending for one of those guys. Rob is the highest placed CCDV member followed by Al Betz and me, we're currently in a four way tie for 11th place along with John Panuzo and Don Peppler, Jr. Al has been getting deep into the rounds by cutting good lights and running his numbers. I have managed to get there by getting into the second or third round in a few of the races. I seem to be stuck in a first round win, second round red light situation, but I've also found other ways to lose in the second round, like losing my opponent in my mirror when he was in my blind spot. He had been hitting the tree great all day, but got a little to anxious and went red against Vic Gandhi, who is really consistent and also hits the tree hard. Thanks go out to Doug for allowing Laura to use his car in this week's race.

August 6th was a big day for Corvettes at Englishtown as Vette Magazine held their annual event with the Challenge following in the afternoon. Several of our members raced in the morning event and did quite well. Glenn Murphy went against Jerry Muniz in the class final and Jerry went on to win the overall title. Edgar Perez getting a free shot at the tree in the first round because of his opponent's red light, hit the tree dead on with a perfect .000 light. He also ran an 11.82 on an 11.80 dial. Both Edgar and I red lighted in the second round against our opponents and that ended CCDV points gathering for the day.

Doug is only one point behind the leader for Rookie of the year. Laura could pull closer in the lead with a few round wins. Her reaction times are getting better and her ET's are settling down. Jim Bole and his son also competed in the Challenge and although not getting into the second round they are getting consistent times out of their cars. We hope they decide to come out next year and run for points.

Jerry Muniz (Boogieman) running a C6 went to Numedia Raceway around the Allentown area on August 20th and won the "Original Street Class" with a 12.92 at 109.78 mph.

Next race day is Sept 3rd. This event starts at 9 AM. As in the past, we will be meeting at Bennigans on Route 611, just north of the Willow Grove Turnpike entrance. We will be departing at 7:40 AM.

Beginning every year in the mid seventies, Dave and Terri Urbanek would visit the Cavalcade at Johnsville Naval Base. They would have a great time looking at CCDV's collection, talking with people and enjoying the day only to have Dave return home "Vette-less" and depressed. He would be so down his young daughters would promise Daddy they were saving their coins to make his one wish come true.

This infirmity known as Corvette fever first presented itself in Dave at the age of fourteen. His neighbor three doors away owned a 4-speed Cordovan Maroon '68 with black interior. Every so often he would drive it around the block and then promptly put it back in the garage. Dave could only stare during these rare appearances while his fever grew.

In 1977, arriving at work each day, Dave would park next to a Corvette driven by a fellow Health and PE instructor at William Tennant High School. He kept hoping she would let him take it for a spin and one day she actually did hand him the keys to go off on his own. Sitting behind the wheel was wonderful and thrilling until he returned and was unable to remove the key. With a red face he finally gave up, left the car to find her and prayed no one would steal it in his absence.

By now the fever was driving Dave and the search was on for his own. Even his Mom diligently kept an eye out and an ear to the ground. She would often call with a lead and Dave would check them out. In 1996, while giving a driving lesson on Bustleton Pike he spotted the one, but when he returned later it was gone. A buddy in this network search saw the same car and jotted down the details. That's all Dave needed to head right over and immediately purchase his '81. Soon restoration began and included rotors, brakes, calibers, rear bearings, shocks, valve covers, gaskets and exterior work. Dave loved the Torch Red, but McElroy's wet sanded it to a beautiful finish. His Vette was ready and so was he, to be found by fellow owners.

One Saturday while Dave was under the car, Bruce Waldron happened to drive past. He stopped in, introduced himself and talked up CCDV. Dave said the first meeting was a little unnerving since he didn't know a soul and couldn't remember what Bruce looked like. Regardless, he kept on attending and has ever since. He loves participating in the Cavalcade each year, the Cruise Nights and especially enjoys the Oreland Parade. He wouldn't think of missing the Hatboro Show, if not for its new restriction of 20 years plus. Other favorites have been the caravan to Chip Miller's and the American Grill run.

One year Dave housed the club's raffle car in his garage and the opportunity to drive the 1991 Steel Blue Metallic convertible created a desire for a C4 of his own. He caught a first run ad in the Intelligencer for a 1994 6-speed Dark Red Metallic with a Hypertech chip and Borla exhaust system. It was 5:30 AM and the urge to call was overwhelming, but courtesy won out. Terri made contact at the more reasonable hour of 9:00 AM (or was it 8:59?). By 4:15 PM they were face to face and in ten minutes he made the purchase on August 1, 2001. Karen and Dennis DiSario were first to share the excitement and the 30-minute test run by Dennis proved this car was in great shape both inside and out.

The Urbanek's 1981 went on to another loving home after six years. Its future buyer would see the car about every six months and kept after Dave to sell it. "It's not for sale" was Dave's constant reply. During the Hatboro Show, he asked again and Dave told him if and only when he found a C4. That little spark of hope spread the fever and for the next two years the man thought about the car every day. When time came to do business, Dave's call was answered by the buyer's wife. She asked him not to contact her husband, since she wanted to surprise him with a great 50th birthday gift. It was a wish come true for someone else.


















