CCDV Safe Driving Event

On May 11th CCDV will co-sponsor a high profile event designed to address the prevention of alcohol and substance abuse among high school students. The location of this event will be at Temple University's Ambler campus. Topics will include safe driving, drug and tobacco avoidance, and teenage social behavior issues such as anger management.

Our co-sponsor will be the Montgomery County Health Department and their Highway Safety Program section. They have direct contacts with each high school in the county and will be recruiting each to attend. They will also produce promotional literature, and mail it to the schools and other interested parties.

In addition, our partners will include the Philadelphia Police Department and their Heads Up drug prevention program, the Southeastern region office of MADD, and Penn DOT's highway safety education unit.

Penn DOT has also generously agreed to promote this event with its extensive network of local TV and radio stations.

The event will begin in the morning and have a duration of approximately three to four hours. The audience will gather for an introductory presentation, and then split into 4 or 5 groups, each group attending presentations by guest speakers in separate classrooms. Each organization will also provide literature handouts as well. The event will end with lunch in the cafeteria.

We have not yet determined the number of cars that CCDV will have on display.

PA Specialty Plate Program

You can NOW place your order for your CCDV PA Specialty License Plate

Please read **General Information and Instructions** first before applying for your Specialty Plate

General Information

- The Corvette Club of Delaware Valley Pennsylvania Specialty License plates are for CCDV members EXCLUSIVELY. All applications MUST be reviewed by CCDV prior to being sent to the PA Department of Transportation for processing.
- No application sent directly to the Department of Transportation by a club member will be processed.
- All applications must be sent to the Department by CCDV in monthly batches. These batches will be submitted on the 15th of each month.
- Requests for Specialty Plates are restricted to passenger vehicles, trucks and motor homes with registered weight of not more than 9,000 lbs.
- Motorcycles and trailers DO NOT qualify for specialty plates.
- Specialty Plates are issued in number sequence only and may not be personalized.
- In reference to the above "SAMPLE" plate, the actual plates will have another digit in place of the word "SAMPLE" i.e.: The first plate issued will be 20001. Also, the actual legal tag number will be 20001-CC; next plate will be 20002-CC, and so on.
- You can order a CCDV Specialty Plate for any or all of your vehicles. These are NOT just for Corvettes. A separate Application must be submitted for each vehicle.

Instructions

You can download application form MV-904SP at **CCDV.com** or you can get your form at the monthly CCDV General Membership meetings.

What you must do after receiving your application form.

- 1. Read the bottom of the application form completely before filling it out.
- 2. Fill out Sections A and D completely
- 3. Make check payable to "Glenn R Murphy"
- 4. Please write "CCDV PA Plate" as a memo on your check.
- 5. Be sure to include check for appropriate amount along with application.
- 6. Please note there is an <u>additional</u> form (MV-1L) needed for those people with leased vehicles. This form can also be downloaded at CCDV.com.
- 7. You can write one check to cover total cost if sending multiple applications.
- 8. Mail completed form and check to:

Your application will now be put into the next batch to be mailed out to Penn DOT for processing.

MY HUSBAND'S '61 SURPRISE

For years my husband, Jim had taken me to Corvettes at Carlisle to decide what year Corvette he would eventually own. In the beginning I felt like it was a wifely duty, but after a while I found myself enjoying it. Eventually he picked the '61 – '62 body style. I cannot tell you much about any other years, but I guarantee you, I know about as much as one can know about the 1961 – 1962 Corvette!



One night we got a phone call from my father saying he had seen a 1961 Corvette for sale on Route 13 in Croyden, Pennsylvania. Without telling my husband, the next morning, a Wednesday, I went to look at the car. When I pulled in, it looked like a pretty nice car. The man got a battery and started it so I figured that was a good thing. It was maroon with black interior and the paint looked good from about 10 feet. It did not have the correct motor and I could tell it wasn't a numbers matching original car, but it was a Corvette. The tires were flat and the salesman said he would get me the VIN plate; he did not have it right then. Finally, I asked him the price. When he said \$13,500, I played dumb and told him that was an awful lot to ask for a care in that shape. I had to at least give it my best shot to get him to lower the price. He stuck to his price and knowing all along I had seen shells of 1961 Corvettes for double that price, I bought the car. The salesman said he would have it delivered on Friday. Now comes the good part. My husband finished work and went to look at the car. When he pulled in, the salesman said he was sorry, but he had just sold the care to some lady earlier that morning. For the next two days, all I heard was my husband crying about the car. How he should have gone that morning and how it looked like such a great car – it was so hard to keep the secret!

Well, Friday night comes and we are getting ready to go to dinner, but no car. My husband thought I was nuts, because I must have told him I had to change my clothes about six times to stall him. I saw the car go by on a rollback, right passed our road. Finally it arrives. Jim answered the door and the most awesome words I ever heard came out of the driver's mouth, "Mr. Doan, I have your Corvette in the driveway." Jim was speechless. When he did finally speak, all he could say is "No way". Needless to say, I didn't get much of a dinner because he wanted to get home to see the car. That night I gave him the title. After looking at it, he told me it was not a VIN number for a Corvette. The VIN plate that was delivered with the car was a new VIN plate from Penn DOT. Jim had to go out of town for work so I was left to clear this up.

After numerous phone calls, I found out the title was for a 1961 Chevy Corvair. I also found out that the correct VIN number could be found on the frame under the driver's side door. So with my brother, a mirror, a flashlight and a toothbrush, we set out to find the real VIN number. We could see all of the numbers except for one; we could not tell if it was an "S" or a "5". Holding my breath, I called Motor Vehicles hoping the car wasn't stolen. The woman on the phone had said that it had not been reported stolen and the last time the car had been registered was in 1975. I was so relieved to hear that. She also said the only thing she could do is give me the name and address of the last registered owner. I called the number and to my surprise, the man still lived at the address with his mother.



Well here we go again. I'm back on the CCDV history trail. Here are some more tales from 20 and 30 years ago.

I'll start with some highlights from 1976:

46,558 T-Tops were produced that year. It was the first year Corvette didn't offer a convertible top and was the last year to show the *Stingray* script name emblem over the Corvette's side vents. It was also the first year to actually offer the YJ8 Aluminum Wheels produced by Kelsey-Hayes (similar wheels in 1973 were rejected because of quality control problems). A partial steel underbelly in the forward section was installed for added rigidity and improved passenger compartment isolation.

In February, CCDV members caravanned to a ski party weekend at Doe Mountain in Seisholtzville, PA (sw of Allentown). Also that month, members Bobby Thompson and Dob Dobbins had separate articles published in national auto magazines: Bob's was on racing modifications for Holley carburetors in *Hot Rod Magazine* and Dob's was on the 1965 Fuel Injection in *Vette Vues*.

The March *Gas Cap* issue included a copy of the NCRS membership application.

In April, CCDV members caravanned to the Renault Winery in Egg Harbor, NJ.

In May, CCDV held a Spring Rally, starting off at the Flourtown Shopping Center on Bethlehem Pike. That month's *Gas Cap* included a reprint of an article from a 1975 issue of *Cars Magazine* featuring Dob Dobbin's 1965 highly optioned fuelie coupe.

Also in May, the 6th Annual Cavalcade's gross receipts were \$14,511.and the Zodiac show car was highlighted at the show (the owner was paid \$200.) CCDV gave a \$1,500 donation to the *Big Brothers Association* plus \$3,000 to the *American Diabetes Association*.

In June, CCDV members traveled up to do another parade lap at the **Shaffer 500** at **Pocono Racetrack** and best of all, Joel Fellman (who?) joined CCDV (has it really been that long?)

In August, a demonstration at **Sun Electronics** in Willow Grove, PA started off the regular membership meeting and the Cavalcade Workers' Party was held at the **Royal Acres** on Bethel Road in Blue Bell, PA

In October, CCDV held a *Monte Carlo - Fall Rally* starting at the Souderton Shopping Center. Of the 29 cars entered, 25 were Vettes. The scenic route included crossing a covered bridge, a run along Lake Noxamixon and ended at the Rowan's home in Harleysville.

Also in October, CCDV members caravanned to and toured the **B & B Winery** in Kingwood, N.J.

In November, CCDV members took part in the Hatboro Parade and Bob Fox joined the technical staff as a freelancer at *Vette'n USA*, from Ludlow, Massachusetts.

This is open to everyone so don't expect to see only Corvettes there, you'll see street rods, survivor muscle cars and imported, pretty much anything that shines on four wheels.

Most folks will bring one of those folding bag chairs and set it up next to their car or by someone they are hanging out with. Just relax and enjoy yourself. There will be food and ice cream for sale. Shortly after we draw the winner of the 50/50 and the good folks at Pep Boys will pick three cars that will each receive a trophy. This is not a car show type of judging, so things like matching numbers or the original factory cigarette lighter knob does not matter. Put a good shine on it and you got a chance. Cars are gone by 10 PM; if you need to leave earlier, you can. And that's it, why do they call it a cruise instead of a park? I don't know! But it's a fun, cheap night out.

Now some highlights from 1986:

After a 10 year hiatus, the roadster returns! There were 7,315 roadsters plus 27,794 coupes produced that year. Chuck Yeager drove a yellow convertible as the Pace Car at the **Indianapolis 500** that year. The **Official Pace Car** decal package was available to buyers of any 1986 Corvette, even coupes, so virtually all 1986 Vettes produced were **Pace Car Replicas**. Anti-lock brakes were introduced and the 1986 Corvette Convertible was named **Motor Trend Magazine's Car of the Year**.

In May, the 16th Annual Cavalcade was held at the Willow Grove Naval Air Station in conjunction with the Navy's celebrating 75 years of naval aviation. A very nice photo ad including a jet and eight CCDV Vettes appeared on the inside front cover of the *Philadelphia Inquirer's Weekend Magazine*. The 16th Annual Cavalcade's gross receipts were \$31,216 (the best ever) and included \$20,677, just from the gate plus \$1,922 from Bryner Chevrolet. Expenses totaled only \$13,840 so that was a very good year for CCDV!

In July, CCDV gave a \$4,400 donation to the Navy Relief Fund, plus a \$1,900 donation to the *American Diabetes Assocation*.

In September, the Cavalcade Workers' Party was held at Joseph's Caterers and a Club picnic was arranged by Louann Lemek.

In October the CCDV membership showed only 51 paid members. We've certainly come a long way since then!
