

#### CCDV Weekend Trip to Rhinebeck, New York August 11, 12 and 13, 2006

Come caravan with Don and Kathie Conrad to the heart of Dutchess County in New York State along the Hudson River. This will be a weekend filled with historic sites, delicious food and wine, and the <u>Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome</u> for an air show focused on restored and original WWI aircraft.

We will visit the <u>FDR Presidential Library and Museum</u> in Hyde Park. This is the lifelong home of President Franklin D. Roosevelt, including gravesite and Rose Garden. We will also tour the <u>Vanderbilt Mansion National Historic Site</u> which was the summer home of Frederick and Louise Vanderbilt, built between 1896 and 1898. This home is representative of the "Gilded Age" of opulence. This exquisite home has a spectacular view of the Hudson River and includes extensive grounds, trails and formal gardens. Our visit will include a stop at the Hyde Park Antique Emporium.

The Old Rhinebeck Aerodrome is a tribute to the by-gone era of aircraft pioneers (1900 - 1937). Antique aircraft and automobiles are ondisplay and in action on the grass airfield. We'll view the Museum and attend the air show of pre-WWI and barnstorming aircraft. Open cockpit bi-plane rides are available before and after the air show.

Accommodations for Friday and Saturday night will be at the Quality Inn in Hyde Park, NY. Fifteen (15) rooms are being held until July 11, so please make your reservations as soon as possible. When reserving your room, please mention that you are part of the CCDV group. The room rate is \$85.99 plus taxes. The phone number at the hotel is: 845-229-0088.

- No application sent directly to the Department of Transportation by a club member will be processed.
- All applications must be sent to the Department by CCDV in monthly batches. These batches will be submitted on the 15th of each month.
- Requests for Specialty Plates are restricted to passenger vehicles, trucks and motor homes with registered weight of not more than 9,000 lbs.
- Motorcycles and trailers DO NOT qualify for specialty plates.
- Specialty Plates are issued in number sequence only and may not be personalized.
- In reference to the above "SAMPLE" plate, the actual plates will have another digit in place of the word "SAMPLE" i.e.: First plate issued will be 20001. Also, the actual legal tag number will be 20001-CC; next plate will be 20002-CC, and so on.
- You can order a CCDV Specialty Plate for any or all of your vehicles. These are NOT just for Corvettes. A separate Application must be submitted for each vehicle.


