

C5/C6 Birthday Bash Event & 2007 Corvette Unveiling

In April 2006, 16 CCDV members Don & Kathie Conrad, Don & Chris Terranova, Tex & Joan Allen, Janet & Frank King, Rick & Lisa Coppola, Bill Lavery, Jim Bole & Linda Ketchersid, Bob Rosenberg, Nick Scull and myself joined 800 other Corvette enthusiasts and attended the C5/C6 Birthday Bash at the National Corvette Museum (NCM) in Bowling Green, KY. Most drove their Corvettes 1600 miles (round trip) for this celebration in a caravan from Willow Grove organized by Don & Kathie Conrad. The purpose of the celebration originally was to honor the birth of the C5 Corvette at the NCM which is directly across the street from the Bowling Green Assembly Plant where the Corvettes are built. The "bash" has since grown into an event where the C6 is also honored. GM marketing and engineering uses this event to showcase new Corvette features. This event included the unveiling of the 2007 Corvette and its few changes including a new exterior color (Atomic Orange), along with a David Hill (Retired Corvette Chief Engineer) retirement dinner, and a Corvette C6-R ALMS racing team emphasis.

The agenda was loaded with hourly seminars in the Chevrolet Theater, a movie theater style auditorium inside the NCM, where hundreds can sit comfortably and listen to speakers on a stage with a wireless microphone. There were several seminars where the C6-R race team spoke to their fans. The racing dinner on Friday night highlighted many ALMS victories by the team and they were presented with an award from the NCM. The indoor activities were a great diversion from the frequent rain that visited us Thursday and Friday.

Wil Cooksey, Plant Manager of the Bowling Green Assembly Plant, provided a presentation on the plant operations in the theater and then took over an hour's worth of questions from the audience about the Corvette

ccdv Safe Driving Event

On May 11th CCDV will co-sponsor a high profile event designed to address the prevention of alcohol and substance abuse among high school students. The location of this event will be at Temple University's Ambler campus. Topics will include safe driving, drug and tobacco avoidance, and teenage social behavior issues such as anger management.

Our co-sponsor will be the Montgomery County Health Department and their Highway Safety Program section. They have direct contacts with each high school in the county and will be recruiting each to attend. They will also produce promotional literature, and mail it to the schools and other interested parties.

In addition, our partners will include the Philadelphia Police Department and their Heads Up Drug Prevention Program, the Southeastern region office of MADD, and Penn DOT's highway safety education unit.

Penn DOT has also generously agreed to promote this event with its extensive network of local TV and radio stations. We anticipate coverage by CBS, NBC and Fox.

The event will begin about 8 AM and have and last approximately six hours (more info later). The audience will gather for an introductory presentation, and then split into 4 or 5 groups, each group attending presentations by guest speakers in separate classrooms. Each organization will also provide literature handouts as well. The event will end with lunch in the cafeteria.

We have not yet determined the number of cars that CCDV will have on display. Please try to bring your Corvette to park in the Corvette only parking area. See page 15 for additional information.





By popular demand we scheduled a gimmick rally for Sunday May 21st. For those of you that have never taken part in a Gimmick Rally, here is your opportunity to have some fun with your Corvette. A Gimmick Rally is NOT a timed event, as a matter of fact, you will loose points if you finish too quickly. You will be given a packet containing a set of direction and puzzles and riddles that if followed correctly will send you through a scenic route. If you do not answer them correctly you will get lost. But don't fret we always include a map that you can open to get you to the final destination.

You will answer questions and solve puzzles along the way. No math, not difficult at all. You will need a navigator. Single drivers will <u>not</u> be allowed to participate for obvious safety reasons. No experience is necessary you have as good a chance to win the rally as someone that has run them many times before. You will need a working odometer. We will meet at an announced location, there I will explain the rally and answer any questions you may have. Be warned if you have been in a rally before don't figure that they are all the same there are many different types. We usually finish 2 or 3 hours later at a restaurant, go over the rally, and announce the winner. The bright spot of the day was that it didn't rain! The Club had a tremendous turnout for this 3rd points race and it was a thrill looking in the rearview mirror and seeing a line of Vettes in different colors and years in the rear view mirror.

Thanks to the racers we are #1 in the Club standings. Our closest competition is 76 points from tying us. Joe Signore and Rob Farley again went the furthest in rounds. Rob was nailing the tree but was having trouble by going under his dial in. Rob is #1 in points with 16, Jerry Muniz is in fourth and Devon Bole is tied for the lead for "Rookie of the Year". Laura is running a little more consistently and rumor has it she'll be getting some new "shoes" for her car. Richy was finally able to get a Saturday off and he had a great day running with a personal best of 12.02. The 11's are right there Richy! New member Ed Quinn rode up with me to the track. Ed's car is a C6 that is blown and has a few other mods. Can't wait to see him run.

I took our new Vette to the track for this race just to get a feel for the car. The car didn't meet my expectation but I've been reading that I need to get a couple of thousand miles on the car before everything loosens up and the car can run like it's suppose to. Although the numbers weren't great they weren't that bad either. Best of the day was a 13.30. MPH was down at 105. The car seemed to run out of steam at the top end. I'm hoping that with more miles on the car this will change. I have to rethink my launch techniques for the automatic, because it sure is different than what I've been use to with our '96 LT4. Overall the car felt great on the ride up and back and I'll take it back later in the year.

There are some new rule changes for this year and some old rules that we have to follow:

These things are required. Long pants and a shirt with sleeves. An approved helmet, Snell 95 or better. A single layer fire jacket if the car has a non-stock blower/turbo installed or nitrous even if you are slower than 10.00 seconds. Mufflers; you cannot run on Saturday if you do not have mufflers or if you have muffler eliminators on your car. You cannot remove your helmet or roll your windows down till you are off the race track surface. A roll cage is required if you run faster than 11.50. A five point harness and a fire jacket are also required at the 11.49 break point. Convertibles cannot dial in under 13.50 unless they have a roll bar or a hard top with integral roll bar installed.

The next race is May 13th. This is 12:00 noon event. We will be leaving Bennigans just north of the Willow Grove Turnpike entrance at 9:45 AM. If you're looking for something to do come on out to either race or cheer us on. We'd love to have you come along!

If you're interested in Solo II competition, contact Frank Gonzalez or visit our website forum. This year there will be several events at the old Johnsville Naval Base on Jacksonville Road in Warminster. There are other events that are close to us and someone that races will be sure to post the locations.

Turn right at the light you will see the park and ride lot on your right.





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
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









He fielded many questions himself and was quoted as saying that people who buy Camaros are saving up to buy a Corvette. He got a good laugh from the audience. He has the likeable personality and timing of a stand-up comedian while still being a corporate business manager. Wil referred many of the paint questions to his paint manager who was there beside him. We learned that the "orange peel" paint issue found on many C5/C6 Corvettes is due to the fact that the non-metallic body panels can not benefit from electrostatic solutions to make paint bond better. He also explained that those who have wet sanded the paint can achieve good results if they know what they are doing, but this is not something GM can do in mass production and they are working regularly to make their paint processes optimal. They admitted that some paint shops can do a nicer paint job since they are not governed by the same environmental regulations that are imposed on a new vehicle manufacturer.

Keeping with the paint discussion, color choices were debated between the audience and Harlan Charles (Corvette Marketing Executive) at length, and at times, the discussion seemed somewhat heated when it came to paint. People questioned GM's focus groups and why the new color for 2007, "Atomic Orange" (a lighter orange than its predecessor) was chosen and why "Daytona Sunset Orange" was dropped. The audience really pressed for the return of "Torch Red" taking potshots at GM. Harlan's position was that the current offerings of Monterey Red and Victory Red looked better on a C6 because of its many body lines. The audience didn't necessarily agree. Tom Wallace, the new Corvette Chief Engineer replacing David Hill, was involved in the discussions at times as well. The Q&A session wandered into other nonpaint related topics such the need for auxiliary audio input on the factory radio, brake pad squeal, and other wish list items. The GM folks agreed to document these many opinions and suggestions indicating that the audience itself was considered a focus group. Later, Tom Wallace gave his own presentation on Corvette market share and held a Q&A of his own. People tried to pry information about the C7 Corvette, but Tom would not budge. He showcased the new key fob for 2007 which integrates the emergency key inside of its casing. Radio volume controls are now also available on the 2007 steering wheel. The drilled rotors found on the Z51 package are now available on the F55 package in 2007 as well. Several new C6 Corvette OEM accessories are now available such as a hood liner with C6 logo, an engine data plaque, new decals and striping, among many other new additions.

We toured the Corvette (and Cadillac XLR) factory, staying on site in a self guided walking tour for over 2 hours. We saw beautiful cars rolling down the line and being put assembled with simplicity resulting from the cutting edge process and specialized machines. The people working there seemed genuinely happy. One worker we spoke with was quite happy that his entire job was to remove a few pieces of tape and put a single screw into the car. He was definitely not the most common employee though. Most worked at a steady pace to mount an entire door on a car or to bolt the body and chassis together. Many workers were happy to speak to us and share in our excitement.

The CCDV group attended many of the seminars in smaller informal groups seated together where possible. We stayed at the Holiday Inn University Plaza in Bowling Green, a fine upscale selection made by Don Terranova. It was directly attached to the convention center where the nightly dinners were held for the David Hill Retirement Party, the ALMS C6-R race team and the C5/C6 Bash Finale. After dinner each night, many of us relaxed in the hotel lobby bar where many other Corvette owners were also indulging. Some CCDV members even got to speak to Johnny O'Connell (ALMS race team driver) and David Hill informally in this setting at the bar area. GM engineers were also around the hotel because of the "Corvette Quality Clinic" being held at the NCM each day for pre-registered C6 owners. I was quite fortunate to speak with a Corvette longtime power train engineer for Corvette for an extended period of time in the hotel bar. He freely spoke of prototyping and testing the C6 mules with Dave Hill and the Corvette team in an informal conversation with me. It was a great unexpected extra for this trip.

I think the CCDV group all took their own greatness from whatever they enjoyed the most. Some found something they were looking for from a vendor who stayed, despite the soggy rain. Some felt fortunate to hear and see information firsthand directly from GM (and get some autographs and photos along the way) or the simple camaraderie of an 800 mile caravan. Some may have just felt closer to the "Corvette Cult" overall. I was happy that I was able to get closer to our local group, while attending a national show.


