It is election time again, but there is a change this year. Absentee ballots will be available should you be unable to attend the November General Membership Meeting at the VE club. It would be a great help to me if you could make sure to include your mailing address when you request the ballot as well as your phone number in the event we would have misinformation on our membership list. It is important to contact me as soon as possible due to the time sensitivity in receiving the ballots prior to the November meeting. All absentee ballots must be received by November 7<sup>th</sup>. If you require a spousal ballot, please include that information as well. Please note: The ballots that are cast at the meeting are secret. An absentee ballot will include your name on the ballot and the ballot must be signed. This step is necessary to keep track of who casts a vote. I can only share the thoughts of the members who have spoken out; I do not know what the others are thinking.

Although we have very strict rules concerning the truly inappropriate material that the moderators govern, I felt there was something else the members were trying to say. So after hearing some of the concerns, I randomly selected some other members in order to get a broader insight of the situation. The consensus is that we are a premier club with a lot of character, compassion and class, but at times the dialog or comments on the web-site are not written with respect or maturity. After gathering their thoughts I will try to be precise and concise on what I heard.

- At times **Displeasure** is written in the form of anger or bashing.
- At times **Disagreement** is written in the form of rage or conflict.
- At times the **Anger** or **Rage** is supported with expletives but using the special characters or an abbreviated word.
- At times innuendos are used as a means to send a message that is negative toward an individual.


Everyone understands the forum is a means to communicate, but they feel the way things are presented could be handled differently. Some have taken offensive to this and have suggested the Board remove the access rights for some and or even shut down the web-site. It was also stated that this could contribute to the decline in number of members posting.
