August 19th Corvette Challenge---There were a few of us that went to an early session to get some seat time for the Challenge, which was held at 4:00 PM. Ed Quinn, Jim and Devon Bole, Ellis, Rob Farley and I competed in the early session. Coming along to get a first hand look at bracket racing were Bill Ehret and his grandson Jason. Devon's girlfriend also joined Rose in the stands to round out the cheering section. I was trying to get some techniques down for running the C6 and it seems to have settled into a very consistent groove. Jim Bole was having a little trouble with his lights, and Devon was trying to get his off again on again line lock problem sorted out. Ellis and Rob were running their numbers all morning and their lights were great. Ellis and I were running the U S Muscle Car as well as the EFI race and as luck would have it we were staged in the wrong line. The E-town officials started pulling the US Muscle Car racers first so we had to snake our way over to the correct lane. There were an odd amount of cars in the Radial Tire 1 (13.49 and quicker) class. El and I were running that round we hurried back to where we were in the GM EFI race. El and I were also running the Radial Tire 1 class there and it ended up that I got another bye. I was doing great and didn't have to run anyone!

In round 2 of the US Muscle Car race I was pitted against a car and driver that has won numerous races and trophies. Yes, I had to run El. I dialed in a 13.30 and left first. I felt my light was pretty good and since the car had been running great all day I kept in it till El was right on my back bumper. I eased off a little and took the stripe. When I picked up my time slip I had broken out with a 13.06. It was the old good news/bad news thing. Got a personal best but also lost the race. That was the quickest the car had run and I had even scrubbed a little speed at the top. El went on to get to the final of the US Muscle Car only to lose to a new GTO that was really running great all day. Nice going El. Back in the GM EFI race I went out in the second round when I forgot to downshift the 6-speed auto into 1st gear. The car literally fell on its smiley face and I was history. The afternoon session began and more CCDV racers joined in to compete in the Corvette Challenge. Joe Signore, Jerry Muniz, Cliff Bray and Mike Campbell, running his new C6 rounded out the already present team. One of the things that is truly amazing in the Corvette Challenge is that in any given race you will likely be paired up with a really good racer who is near the top of their game. I had to run Neil Vernarelli who was running his dad's '57 Vette. I had run Neil in a time shot and he whipped me pretty bad. I spun a little on the line in that time trial and he took the stripe. We run close to each others dial, he dialed 13.41, I dialed 13.30. We both had good lights, Neil had a .034 and I had a .048 but his car slowed a bit and I found myself a car length ahead. I let him come up on me till I only had a half car on him and we crossed the finish line. I looked over at the wall where there is a light bulb that goes on when you win and it wasn't on! How could I have lost? I didn't think or felt I broke out. When I got my time slip it showed that I had won. The win light on that side of the track had burned out and they hadn't replaced it yet. Well I sure felt good about taking that win since I had done everything right and I didn't break out. Going into second round were Joe, Mike, Rob and me.

Pedaling for a great cause -- and Caren

After I registered for the MS 150 bike tour, my sister Caren was the first person I called.

"Hey, I'm going to ride 45 miles in the MS 150," I said. "I'm supposed to ride in honor of somebody. Do you know of anyone?"

Caren laughed long and loud, like only she can. MS isn't a laughing matter, of course, and Caren knows this as well as anybody.

Two years ago, she was diagnosed with MS, a neurological disease that affects the central nervous system.

Not once have I heard her complain about the disease's effects, or express fear about the future. Rather, she assures family and friends that she is well and that her quality of life is as high as ever.

She's still playing softball, winning pool tournaments, working on a dozen projects at once, and flying around the world. Last week, she was running into walls in Cape May during a game of "Superman" she invented for our niece, Estella. It was hard to tell who was laughing more.

Still, Caren must give herself daily shots of interferon, take multiple pills, and visit regularly with her doctors so she can function so well.

The MS 150 raises funds for research, services, community programs, training, education, and administration. For every dollar raised, 83 cents is spent towards ending the devastating effects of MS.
