

With two races in the beginning of July we were kept busy, but the long layoff between the Challenge races really hurt some of us that didn't get a chance to run at other venues.

The first race in July, held on the 7<sup>th</sup> was hot, as the temperature reached 90, but no rain. Doug Bereczki went the furthest in rounds, getting to the fourth. He has a spot in the top ten so far and is really running his numbers. Vince Pileggi came out with his car and ran well. There is still some tuning to be done, but despite that he was running strong in the eighth mile. He was shutting down at the eighth to avoid getting kicked off because of no roll cage.

The second race in July, held on the 14<sup>th</sup>, was a carbon copy of the first race in July, weather wise. Ellis Gray made it to the fifth round, getting beat by .03; tough one El. Joe Signore's car has been running well and he has taken out some heavy hitters, right Jerry?

The three CCDV teams are not faring well this year as the top CCDV team, led by Rob Farley, is in fifth place in the team standings. We hope to shake the first round loses and score some big points before the end of the season and climb out of the cellar. What makes it hard for the CCDVers, is we find ourselves running each other in rounds because there are so many of us. It's always hard running against friends.

Running in brackets is all about being consistent and you have to keep that going the whole year or you're not going to get into the money rounds. Some of the most consistent cars in the Club, are owned by Ellis, Doug, Farley, and Ron Lynch. Even if the driver falters the cars do not. What has plagued some of us is our cars not performing the same in every race. With sometimes only two time trials it is hard to dial-in when there is such a huge difference in runs. There are measures you can take to try to get the car to run the same every run. Checking tire pressures, racing at the same coolant and tranny temp, doing the same burnout routine every time, all help to make the car run the same every time. The starting line crew plays a big part in how well you do and E-town's starting crew has come a long way since the beginning of the season. Keeping the water box wet and cleaning the burnout box of chunks of rubber all help to keep the cars running consistent. Modifying our cars is a part of the Corvette experience we seem to enjoy, but any mod, performance mods that is, can and usually does impact the car to make it different than what you've been used to racing. It will take time to get use to the car again and that sometimes can be very painful.

I've been asking myself lately about the whole concept of drag racing; its pros and cons. Why do I enjoy going to race in the heat of summer and the cold of March and November. I race because I enjoy, really enjoy, going fast. I enjoy it when everything comes together and I get a great run. I enjoy the sounds of the car as it races down the track. I enjoy trying to cut good lights and I enjoy winning. I enjoy being with friends and fellow Corvette enthusiast and racing against them. I think the thing I enjoy most is becoming a part of the car and knowing what to expect and when to expect it. Not only knowing that something isn't right, but why it isn't right. I still have a way to go before I feel as comfortable racing in the '06 as I did in my '96, but putting more races under my belt should make that happen.
