Going Racing

Yep, it's cold outside and we're probably going to get a few inches of snow soon, but we have had a fairly mild winter up until this point in time. So what do we racers think about when it gets like this? Well if you're a Corvette Challenge racer, you'll be thinking about the upcoming season and if you can swing the time off, a trip to Sandston, Virginia to race in the National Corvette Challenge. It's about five hours away and the chances of it being warmer than here are pretty good. There will plenty of racing action as around 126 people have signed up to race in not only the brackets but also the index classes and Pro Classes. Index racing is similar to bracket racing, but the idea is to run as close to the index, say 11.00 seconds, and not break out. What makes this interesting is there are a lot of cars that can run 11.00 seconds all day long, so the tree becomes even more important. Also you race on a pro tree as opposed to the regular tree. The pro tree has all the ambers coming on at once and it can either be a .500 tree or a .400 tree. The regular tree has the amber lights coming on .500 seconds after the previous light. The pro tree is what you're likely to see on ESPN when they have their pro events. This National Challenge will also be on internet TV. Here are the details that I cut from Edgar Perez' post on the Corvette Forum:

Coverage will be online Friday night Feb 23 from the hotel meet and greet and Saturday night in streaming video.

Visit www.yourwaynetwork.com and you can see Corvette coverage from the previous event if you click on the Hole Shot TV link."

Who knows, you may even see one of your fellow Club members on Web TV!!

We also have the Corvette Challenge Banquet on February 3rd. This is always a good time and we get the chance to catch up with people we haven't seen in awhile.

Other things that are happening on the racing scene are the SCCA Solo II races that will be coming back to the old Johnsville Naval Air Development Station. These are always fun to run or watch and there will more than likely be a few CCDVers there.

Also from the SCCA is a Performance Driving Experience (PDX) being held on Friday, June 15th and Saturday, June 16th. There's a lot of good information in a thread on our forum, thanks Glenn.

Registration form (page 16): The fee for the show is \$15 per car (pre-register by May 19, 2007 or pay the day of the show). The first 200 people to pre-register will receive a 'BIG CORVETTE ROUNDUP' dash plaque. Also pre-registered cars that belong to a Corvette Club will have their club's color logos printed on the windshield placards (A digital image of the Club's logo must be emailed to bigroundup@yahoo.com before May 5, 2007).

The fee for the optional gimmick rally is \$15 per car; in addition to the \$15 show fee. You may also pre-register for the Gimmick Rally by May 19, 2007. Pre-registering will guarantee you a place in the rally, limited to the first 75 vehicles. All roads will be Corvette friendly and no prior rally experience is necessary. These rallies are lots of fun. Trophies for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place will be awarded. We will have a meeting of all rally participants at 9AM sharp to give instructions and answer any questions. CCDV and SADD

SADD no longer stands for Students Against Drunk Driving. A few years back they adopted a more broad position as Students Against Destructive Decisions. As many of you are aware, last year the Club sponsored a **SADD** "Leadership Seminar" in conjunction with the Montgomery County Bureau of Traffic Safety.

Invited were students from 165 area schools with **SADD** chapters and different organizations designed to help the student leaders of their individual **SADD** group with ammunition, ideas and contact information to take back to their schools and help them implement a way to bring the message to other teens who may be in crisis. Anyone who attended this event last year was extremely impressed with the breakout sessions, especially the Philadelphia Police's opening, which impacted each one of us in attendance.

The event is scheduled again this year for March 15th at the Pottstown Campus of the Montgomery Community College. They have graciously extended the use of their facility at no cost. The Montgomery County Board of Health is promoting the event with all the area schools and prepared goodie bags with the **CCDV** logo and **SADD** logos for the participants of the seminar. Each participant will receive a T-Shirt and special "dog tags". A major part of our participation in the event is supplying breakfast and lunch for the students and speakers. Last year the cost of the food was approximately \$2,500 and this expense was totally picked up by an anonymous donor. The cost of food per attendee is about \$10.


