Here's hoping everyone had a safe and happy Holiday Season!

First, I'd like to welcome any new members to the Club and invite them to either come out to race or watch any of the competitive racing events that are scheduled for 2007.

CCDV has deep roots in Auto Cross/Road Race. Several auto cross events were held at the old Johnsville Naval Air Station in Warminster this past year and attended by several of our members.

Auto Cross Solo II involves driving your car around a course laid out with traffic cones in a big area, like a parking lot. You compete in different classes based on the kind of car you drive and the modifications that been done to the car. There are strict guidelines for modifications for the different classes and you must adhere to them to be able to race. We've had several champions in the Auto X from CCDV. "Skeets" Mariano held the national title for several years before moving on to the Road Course series. Frank Gonzales is one of the best auto cross drivers in this area and has competed at the national level several times. Frank is willing to help anyone interested in autocross "Solo II". Don and Kathie Conrad, successful racing husband and wife team, are also in CCDV. Seek out those members if you'd like to try your hand at Auto Cross. It's a fun and safe way to spend a day "driving" your Vette. Races are held at several places throughout the area. You can find more information on the web at www.scca.com.

Some of our members like to take their Vettes to track days at the major road racing courses in the area. At these events you get to drive your car at high speed on tracks that the pros race on. High speed events such as these are usually only held a couple of times a year and there is a class that one must complete before you're allowed to go out on the course. Watch our forum website, at <u>www.ccdv.com</u> for details and dates of events that may come up throughout the year.

Last, and close to my heart is drag racing. The Corvette Challenge is a series of ten races held from early spring through fall at Englishtown's Raceway Park in New Jersey. CCDV is also one of the sponsors of the series. Last year's champion was fellow Club member Rob Farely. Rookie of the Year was won by Devon Bole, also of CCDV. It is no small feat to get to those finishes as the series has some of the best drivers and cars on the East Coast. We not only compete in the Challenge but also other local events as well as national events, when they are held close enough to our area. Several of the members have also competed at other drag strip events and usually come home with first or second place finishes. The Corvette Challenge Club Challenge Cup was won by CCDV's Racing Team for the fourth time this past year. For more information on the Challenge visit http://www.corvettechallenge.info/on the web.

It was difficult to find the ideal location that would allow us to put on a show. In an unusual moment of clarity it came to me, Becky's Drive-In Theatre. It was perfect they can hold 750 plus cars. They were built for vehicular traffic. They have a concession building that can feed us breakfast, lunch and dinner. They have bathrooms. They have a booth that we can use to collect the registration fees. They have an FM transmitter that they use to transmit the audio signal for the movies that we can use for music and announcements if we wish. All the metal speaker poles are gone which gives the place to park and look and without dented doors. After the event we can hang around and watch two full length feature films if we wish. Becky's is located about 15 miles north of Allentown, PA, right down the road from the town of Jim Thorpe in the mountains, a very scenic drive.

I called the owners of Becky's Drive-In and told them what I had in mind. They were ecstatic about the idea and told me that they wanted to do something like this for years, but did not know how to get it started. A match made in heaven. It's a done deal and on June 2nd with a rain date on June 9th, we will have our very first annual **BIG CORVETTE ROUNDUP**. It will be a judged car show. The judging team will consist of our members as well as other Corvette club members. This will be a Corvette only event. The registration fee will be very reasonable \$15. We will offer a gimmick rally for and additional fee, free slow drag race, Corvette trivia contest throughout the day and the movies will be extra of course. We will offer other activities, however we are still working on them and not yet ready to announce them.

I posted a short announcement on the website some time ago to test the waters and to ask for help to pull this off. I was very pleased to see the level of commitment to help, the enthusiasm was overwhelming. I'm very excited about this as I'm sure you are and will be contacting all of those people who have offered to help.
