### A Day at the Races.... Not the Marx Brothers comedy!

With a lull in the racing action for us Corvette Challenge racers till July 7<sup>th</sup> and needing some excitement. Rose and I headed to the Nationals at E-town on Friday. June 22<sup>nd</sup>. It was a great for spectating and racing as there were several records set that day. Running 2 of the 4 gualifying heats were the Pro Classes, Pro Bike, Pro Street, Pro top fuel Dragster and Pro top fuel funny cars. Also running were Pro Mod cars, Super Comp cars and Super Stock eliminations. We arrived a little after 11:00 AM and from the sounds coming from the track we should have gotten there earlier. The classes that seem to get the most media attention are the Top Fuel and Funny cars and Pro Stock and Pro Bikes. The first gualifying round for these classes was no indication of what these vehicles could do as round after round saw at least one of the cars in the Top Fuel and Funny car classes lose traction and coast through the top end. The results after round 1 in Pro Bike had Andrew Hines running a 6.932 @ 190.59 mph. Pro Stock had Greg Anderson turning a 6.609 @ 209.62 mph to get into the number 1 position. The number 1 position in Funny Car was Tommy Johnson, Jr. who ran a 4.775 @ 315.93 mph. The Top Fuel leader going into the second round was Brandon Bernstein who turned in a 4.538 @ 328.54 mph. As the day wore on the air was getting better and better and as a result the cars were getting quicker. The second round had some strong runs in Pro bike but at the end of the day that class had Andrew Hines running a 6.910 @ 193.57 mph. Richie Stevens took over the lead in Pro stock with a 6.598 @ 209.20 mph. Tommy Johnson, Jr. held onto the number 1 position running a 4.729 @ 321.96 mph. The lead in Top Fuel went to Tony Schumacher running a 4.455 @ 331.94 mph. In the Pro Bike final Craig Treble with a 6.990 @ 191.70 mph took out Andrew Hines who ran a 7.003 @ 190.48 mph. Pro stock winner was Greg Anderson who ran a 6.617 @ 209.52 mph. Jeg Coughlin went red with a -.007 to give the victory to Greg Anderson. Tommy Johnson Jr. kept his winning ways up for this event with a 4.994 @ 305.84 mph to beat out Tony Pedregon's 5.022 @ 306.33 mph. The final in Top Fuel had Larry Dixon's 4.625 @ 321.73 mph beating out Doug Herbert who ran a 4.675 @ 316.30 mph.

What was amazing to me is that the spread between the top 16 qualifiers who made it to eliminations in Pro Stock went from a 6.592 to a 6.643, a difference of only 0.051 seconds. Talk about tight racing.

One of the highlights of the day though was when the Funny Cars and Top Fuel cars were running at night. The flames were at least eight foot high coming from their zoomie headers into the night sky, and the vibrations that your body feels as they go by at over 300 mph in a little over 4 seconds was exciting to say the least. We were even getting some heat thrown our way as they went by. If you've never been to a National event you should try to get to one when they come to our area. Maple Grove and Englishtown both host these events so look for them when they come around.

We get back to racing in the ECS Corvette Challenge on July 7<sup>th</sup> and July 14<sup>th</sup>. Both events start at 11:00 AM. Keep an eye on our website in the racing section for more information as the dates get closer.



If you cross the PA Turnpike you went too far. After you cross Susquehanna (1st light) you will go down a long hill, the Acme will be on your right near the bottom of the hill.

The Fire Company has a judge fire truck competition sort of Fire truck show and go. They will also award 3 trophies to the nicest Corvettes. Be advised the judges know fire trucks inside and out, not Corvettes. So shine your Vette up real good, it's gotta have a shine as good as their trucks to win.


