The season is half over and the CCDV racers are doing a great job holding their own. It seems like when one person has a bad day the rest of the teams members have a good day.

This past race John Burbich and Mike Campbell went rounds. Barb Grippo again went a couple rounds and is tied for third for "Rookie of the Year". Tad Archambault and Bill Ehret are in 9th and 10th place in the Rookie race. Doug B is on a roll and is currently in 8th place in the point standings. CCDV Teams are currently holding 7th, 9th and 12th place. Jerry Muniz also went rounds in his beautiful black C6. Jerry just got a new set of CCW rims. He put some "skinnies" up front and some monster tires on the rear. Looking good Boogieman! Jim Bole has been running steady and is in 10th place in the CC point standings. Joe Signore is running pretty good in his red C6 and now that he has a tranny cooler in his car, it should be more consistent than before.

The air pressure in your tires should be checked before each race and adjusted so you can do your burnouts the same. When doing your burnouts, do them the same way every time. Stage the same way every race and if you want to try something new or different then run time trials or a test and tune. One of our newer members, Bob, runs just time trials in his Yellow C5. He didn't sign up for points this year because he wants to get the feel for the car and the track. I've learned the hard way that changing one thing in your routine can mean the difference in winning and losing. Trust me, trying something different when running a points race is not going to put you into the next round.

To all the racers that couldn't make the last race, we missed you so try to make it to the next Challenge race which is on July 7th. Gates will open at 11:00 AM. There is also going to be a Trophy Marathon and Index racing on May 26th. Gates open at 9:00 AM. Keep an eye on the racing section of the CCDV forum on our website at www.ccdv.com for updates and race dates. By the way, spectators and cheerleaders are always welcome.





CCDV Specialty Plates

Wouldn't this specialty plate look better on the back of your Corvette than the standard issue Pennsylvania (3 letters & 4 numbers) license plate?

All the information needed is on your current registration card. You can buy a CCDV plate at any time of the year for \$22.50 *. You do not need to wait for your current registration to expire. This seems to confuse people who think they need wait to get their plate. This is incorrect as you can buy your plate at any time during your registration cycle. The \$22.50 * is a one time charge. You will receive your new CCDV and your future renewal dates and the cost will be the same as it has for previous years.

* There will be an increase to \$24.00 per plate starting July 1, 2007
