First round eliminations didn't come until 3:15! That's a little off of a 1:00 PM start. So not only did we have to wait 1-½ months to race, we also had had to wait an additional 2 hours to start! Unfortunately a few of us were rusty. Rob Farley, Joe Signore, and Jerry Muniz went out in the first round. Ellis Gray had transmission problems and was unable to make the call. One bright spot in round one was Cliff Bray. He was paired up with our Corvette Challenge coordinator Edgar Perez. Cliff crossed the stripe first! After a whole season of working at it Cliff got his first win. Good job Cliff! Second round wasn't too friendly to our drivers either. Mike Campbell, Jim Bole and Cliff Bray went out in round two. Jim Bole got an education in round 2. As he crossed the stripe well ahead of his opponent and off the gas he heard that he broke out by 1 second. The tower had his dial time at 13.63. Jim has a mid 12 second car! He had failed to check his dial in time on the board. Needless to say Jim will always be checking the board for his dial in time from now on. Hats off to Rob Farley for getting this event off the ground. Things look positive to have this be a new class in 2008.

Our October 27th Corvette Challenge race was rained out. The rescheduled last race of the season is now November 17th at 9:00 AM. The air is usually good for fast cars in November. So come on out to either race your Vette or cheer our drivers on.






