CCDV is proud to again sponsor the Students Against Destructive Decisions (SADD) "Leadership Seminar" in conjunction with the Montgomery County Bureau of Traffic Safety. The date is Friday, April 25th 7:30 AM to 2:00 PM at the Montgomery County Fire Academy, 1175 Conshohocken Rd., Conshohocken, PA.

This Seminar is geared toward schools with SADD chapters. The event arms the student leaders of their individual SADD groups with ideas and contact information to take back to their schools and assists with implementation of programs at their schools that target teens that may be in crisis. This year's theme is "SADD SURVIVOR". There is a lot of enthusiasm surrounding the event this year. In addition to the breakout sessions that address specific areas such as "Positive Body Image" that addresses cutting and bulimia and "Drug and Alcohol" abuse, there will be a mock crash set up with student participation, crashed vehicles, ambulances, a medivac helicopter landing at the scene and the coroner pronouncing someone dead at the scene. It should be a real eye opening presentation.

We are looking for 8 to 10 volunteers to bring their cars for a mini car show in the parking lot and to assist in registration or talking to the kids about the cars if they have any questions.

As our Club contribution to the event, CCDV will pick up the cost of breakfast and lunch for the attendees (approximately \$10 per person). We anticipate approximately 200 -250 attendees. 

Going Racing

Winter is finally over and the race season has begun!!! Three events got us started in March. A Corvette vs GTO race and two Corvette Challenges were the lead off events.

On March 9th the first ever Corvette vs GTO event was held at Atco Raceway in New Jersey. This event was conceived, coordinated, and executed by Bruce Katz of GONE (GTO owners of the North East). Bruce put forth a tremendous effort in getting this event scheduled. He was able to get several sponsors on board to provide the payouts for the different classes.

Eight CCDV members were able to make it out to this event. The weather felt more like the dead of winter than early Spring. It was a bright sunny day, BUT very windy and cold. When we arrived it was in the mid 30's and by race time it was a balmy 41° F. The combination of the cold and wind forced the track officials to limit the racing to the 1/8th mile. So reaction time would play a much more important role in the day's racing.

Slow reaction times would force Ellis Gray, Jerry Muniz and Joel Fellman out in the first round. Richy Josephs and Mike Campbell would also suffer a loss because of a slower reaction time in round two. Tony Buonassi on the other hand was turning out good reaction times but went under by .08 in the third round. I got the advantage of two red lights on my way to a red light foul myself in the 4th round.

Meanwhile Ken Lynch was photographing and filming the racing action. Ken was at the starting line enduring the full force of the wind and arctic temperatures to provide each of us with a picture AND a DVD of the event. Thanks Ken.


Corvettes drivers would go on to win 2 out of the 3 classes. The street tire class and the drag radial class were won by the Vette drivers while the heads-up pro tree class would go to a GTO driver. Even though the cold weather and the 1/8 mile racing kept a number of racers away, approximately 70 racers turned out for the event. I for one would like to see Bruce Katz make this an annual event.

The following Saturday, March 15th, the first Corvette Challenge of 2008 was held at Englishtown. The top 16 race of 2007 that was rained out last year, was also run. Turn out was light with only 37 Vettes making the show. Tony Bounassi, Joe Signore, Jerry Muniz, Jim Bole, Ellis Gray, and I were the CCDV club members that showed up for the event.

Jim, Ellis and I participated in the top 16 race, while Tony, Jerry, and Joe raced in the Corvette Challenge. I was able to make it to the semi final round in the top 16. Unfortunately I was "chasing my dial-in time" all day and was unable to run my number against Ralph Savarese in the semi final. Ellis was dead on his dial all day running a consistent 10.85 in several of his elimination runs. He *fortunately* lost first round race in the top 16, and was able to participate in the Corvette Challenge. Ellis would go on to make it to the final round. He ended up racing Joe Latona who was running a consistent 10.86 all day. The both of them got together before the race and agreed to both dial in at 10.50 so they could have a heads up race with out the possibility of breaking-out! To everybody's memory this would be the first heads-up final in the Corvette Challenge. Anticipation was high at the start of the race. Unfortunately it was over at the start as Ellis spun out of the hole. Something is telling me that this will not be the last time this year that Ellis will be in the final round.

At press time the second Corvette Challenge event has not been run yet. I will report on that one in the May Gas Cap. The next Corvette Challenge is April 12th. The Pro 8 race will also be held on the 12th. So come on out to participate or watch some of the fastest Vettes in the area. Hope to see you there.







