
If you are planning to go to the show, but can not join us on the bus trip, you may still purchase show tickets at the \$15.00 discounted price.


As in past years, we would like to go to dinner either in Atlantic City or after we return to Willow Grove. This is still being planned and will be announced when we know more.

In 6/90, the initial ground breaking ceremonies take place.

In 8/91, CCDV pays \$100 and becomes an NCM Founding Member.

In 6/92, additional ground breaking takes place during the Bowling Green Corvette Homecoming Event.

In 7/94, the NCM officially opens over the Labor Day weekend with almost 120,000 people in attendance including many Corvette dignitaries.

In 7/96, CCDV purchased 4 large Club bricks.

In 9/97, Club President Mike Burke, appoints Bob Weiss to be our 1st NCM Ambassador.

In 10/98, CCDV purchases 2 more bricks to commemorate our 25th Annual Cavalcade and the Club's 40th Anniversary.

In 10/01, CCDV becomes 1 of only 7 Corvette Clubs and related supporters to become a Lifetime NCM Business Member.

There are approximately 25,000 NCM members. There are slightly over 60 Corvette Clubs listed in their Business Directory of which 20 are "Lifetime Business Members". Of the 60 Clubs, only 3 are located in Pennsylvania and only 2 of those are Lifetime Business Members. We should all be proud that CCDV is one of these 2 Clubs!! So as you can see, CCDV is a major supporter and has long time close ties with the National Corvette Museum.

In the past, the NCM has also had a special display of several different CCDV items, including our Club's 40th Anniversary polo shirt, a CCDV window sticker, past Gas Cap newsletters, varied photos and our Club's documented history booklet.
