End of Parade to Firehouse: When Parade ends you will be on Enfield Rd with the baseball field to your right.

Go straight ahead on Enfield to the "Y" intersection
Bear right to stay on Enfield Rd.
Go 1 block to end and turn right onto Kingston Rd.
Follow Kingston around as it continues bending to the left.
Turn right onto Barclay Rd.

Follow 200 feet to end.

Turn right onto Oreland Mill Rd.

Follow Oreland Mill Rd 1/4 mile to Plymouth Ave.

Turn right onto Plymouth Ave.

Follow 2 long blocks and turn right onto Walnut Ave.

Go 1 block and turn left onto Roesch Ave.

Follow 1 block to end.

Park along the left side of Roesch Ave

Walk ahead to the end and turn right on Bruce Rd. Firehouse will be on your right after you cross over RR Tracks

Go 1 block to end and turn right onto Kingston Rd.

Turn right onto Barclay Rd.

Follow 200 feet to end.

Turn right onto Oreland Mill Rd.

Follow Oreland Mill Rd 1 block.

Turn left onto Meadow Lane.

Follow Meadow 3 blocks to the end and turn right onto Church Rd (rte 73)

Go about 1/4 mile and bear right onto rte 309 North.

Follow 309 about 3/4 mile to the Turnpike entrance.

Take Turnpike (I-276) East

If heading home from the Firehouse afterwards

If you parked along Roesch Ave.



Cost?


