CECF UPDATE

Hi everyone...it's Dave Bresler -CECF's newest Board member with an update about the CECF. First of all - what does CECF stand for? It's our Corvette Enthusiasts Community Foundation - the charitable arm of the Corvette Club of Delaware Valley. The CECF was founded over 14 years ago as a charitable entity - a 501 (c) 3. Our main source of income was and continues to be from the sales of our raffle car tickets. The Foundation was started with a donation of \$3500 from the CCDV. This seed money was soon repaid, and the CECF was off and running! We're proud to report that the CECF is a squeeky-clean organization. It has passed both IRS and CCDV audits with flying colors. We are fortunate to have Steve Howard - an attorney and CPA - on our Board. As most of you already know, we have given out hundreds of thousands of dollars to charitable organizations over the years. Some well-known recipients of our efforts have been the Sunshine Foundation, Juvenile Diabetes, Multiple Sclerosis Society (MS), Big Brothers of America, Naval Military Welfare & Recreation, Chip Miller Foundation, and the National Corvette Museum. Our nest egg of \$100,000 is used to spin off the \$1500 of interest that barely covers our expenses, including postage, and the annual required audit that, by itself, costs \$1,000. Much of the year, our balance is less than that as it doesn't take into account the money spent to buy the raffle car.

WE need your help to sell all of this years tickets! As the Ticket Czar, I have the responsibility of dispersing ALL of the tickets to CCDV members to sell to the public, including friends, co-workers, relatives, etc. Many have already purchased blocks of tickets to give out as presents and rewards at work. WE need to get these tickets out of my duffle bag and into YOUR hands. If you can't sell them all, just return them to us with the stubs (and money) you did sell and we will assign them to someone else. The truth is that if EVERYONE in the club would buy or sell 5 tickets, we would sell out right away! Please see me at the next meeting on June 11th, to get 10, 20, or more tickets assigned to you to sell or keep for yourself. I'll be sitting at the table nearest the stage. Remember, If you sell or buy 9 tickets, you get the 10th one FREE. If you need tickets before the meeting, or will not be attending - just call my cell phone and I will mail them to you right away. 

Going Racing

The second and third points race of the <u>East Coast Supercharging</u> Corvette Challenge brings us into April. April 4th is up first and it's another wacky weather day. Let's review, first race, the warm-up race it was 70* in MARCH, and the 1st points race starts out at 36* and struggled to reach 50*. And what do we get for April 4th? WIND and lots of it, sustained winds of 25mph with gusts up to 50mph! Because of the wind Raceway Park limited the racing to the 1/8 mile for safety. The weather sure does keep things interesting.

Four CCDV members found their way to the track for the third event. Mike Campbell, Jerry Muniz aka 'Boogieman', Ellis Gray, and I were ready to race and score points, some more enthusiastic than others. Mike was not too pleased to drive all the way to the track and find out that the ¼ mile was cut in half. I on the other hand was kind of looking forward to race the 1/8 mile again. We raced the 1/8 mile for the last points race of 08. In that race I completely miss judged the finish line and broke out even though I killed my opponent on the tree. So I was looking to redeem myself. 'Boogieman' was "loaded for bear" competing in the Challenge and the 11.5 (7.40) Corvette index race also. Ellis was also competing in the index race. Since Real Street was running also, I entered that race as well.

Mike's day was ended early in round one. He gave it his best shot with a .004 reaction time! Generally when you cut a light that good you go on to win the race. But out of 59 other drivers Mike managed to get lined up against Ellis. Ellis cuts a .051 light and drives around Mike with a 7.419 on a 7.41 dial!!! 'Boogieman' dials in at 7.38 and runs a **7.383** in round 1 for the win! I cut my second best light of the day at .029 and took out Ken Rammer, one of ECSCC's best guys on the tree. In the second round we were on the ladder. I end # 2 on the ladder with my .029 light. Jerry bows out in round 2. Ellis goes on to round 6 and I go on to round 6 also. Round 6 is the FINAL round! Ellis and I make CCDV history. It's the first time in the ECSCC that two CCDV club members would pair up in the final! It turned out to be a great race. Ellis cuts a .028 light and runs a 7.382 on a 7.35 dial. I run my dial with a 2! (9.052 on a 9.05) and cut a .067 light. Ellis takes the win by .0099! That's about 1.35 inches!!!! Ellis wins his 2nd Corvette Challenge event. The last time he won was back in October of 2002. That win put Ellis in first place and my runner-up finish bumped me up to 5th place. Ellis also picked up the best reaction time award in the 7.40 index race with his .017 on a pro tree!

The third points race was supposed to be on the 11th, but it was rained out. That race has been rescheduled to the 7th of November.

Corvette vs. GTO racing was held at E-town on April 25th. 'Boogieman' and I made it out to Raceway Park for this event. My time shot lights were fantastic .002, .009, and .013. In the first round of the Vette vs. GTO race I end up getting paired up with another Vette! That's right a Vette. Not enough GTO's showed up. I cut a decent light, .046 and run pretty close to my dial, but lose by .0038! Glad it wasn't a points day. Jerry had a rough start. His time shots were 11.70 and 11.68. He wasn't happy. He was hoping to get some seat time for the upcoming 11.50 race, and 11.7 wasn't going to cut it! He got a hold of Julio from **Cartek racing** to see if he could get a different set of nitrous jets so he could get his times closer to 11.50. Julio didn't have a set, but he was able to get a set from a GTO racer! Changed the jets in the staging lanes while Jerry's lane was called, and first pass with the borrowed jets was an 11.47. That's what Jerry was looking for! That's what is so great about drag

racing. Any racer is always ready to help another even though they might end up facing each other in eliminations!

After all that pre-race excitement Jerry won his first round. In the second round Jerry was only off his dial by .02 but lost the race at the tree. We both entered other races but neither one of us made it past the first round. I lost a couple of very close races and Jerry had some traction issues.

The third Corvette Challenge points race is in the books. CCDV had a good turnout. This cloudy warm May day brought out Tony Buonassisi, Bob Bern, Tad Archambault, Joe Signore, and me. We met at the old Bennigans and traveled to the track together. It looked pretty cool with five red Vettes representing 3 generations in a line on the Turnpike. Ellis Gray and Jerry Muniz met us at the track. It wasn't looking good for fast times with the DA hovering around 2300' and the temps in the low 80s. What happened to Spring with favorable weather for fast times!!!

When the time runs started my fan stopped working. NOT GOOD! I got tools and electrical connecters from a Pro 10 racer and got everything working again. That's what is great about drag racers, everybody is willing to help when asked. In round 1, 3 CCDV members exited. Round 2 saw three more CCDV members hit the pits. That left Jerry Muniz carrying the banner for CCDV. In rounds 1&2 Jerry was HOT running dead on his dial in both rounds! 11.857 on a 11.85 dial in round one and in round two 11.908 on a 11.90 dial! In the third round Jerry got a break to cool down by way of a red light from his competitor. Round 4 pitted Jerry against Eric Fisher. In the lanes Jerry saw that Fisher had dialed in at 11.80. So Jerry thought it would be fun to have a heads up race and also dialed in at 11,80! It was a good race. Eric got a slight advantage at the line leaving .040 before Jerry. Jerry made up the difference and crossed the finish line first. But unfortunately Jerry's car picked up .004 and he broke out running 11.796 on his 11.80 dial!

Both Jerry and Ellis entered the 11.50 index race. You may be thinking why Jerry would enter that race running 11.9 and 11.8 in the Challenge. For the 11.50 race Jerry gives his Vette a boost with a little nitrous and is able to run 11.5xx. After two qualifying runs Ellis and Jerry ended up 1 and 2 on the ladder!!! Ellis qualified at 11.500!!!!!! Can't get any better than that. Jerry's qualifying time was right up there at 11.506! In round one Ellis ran an 11.504, but was a little late of the line and lost at the finish line. Jerry on the other hand ran through the field and ended up in the final round! Why am I telling you this?




Cost?
