For the past 16 years Eagle One's Golden Rule Awards have confirmed that there is more to car clubs than cars. The driving force for most clubs in providing great support to community and charitable causes.

The Corvette club of Delaware Valley, based in Philadelphia, PA, received the coveted award for conducting the most outstanding community service program in the eastern region during 2008.

The 588- member club will receive a cash donation of \$500 for a favorite charity. In addition, all clubs will receive a custom-designed trophy and a generous supply of Eagle one car-care products and Valvoline motor oil for fund-raising purposes. The club paid for the box lunches which equated to \$1,800 and helped to give them out.
- Assisted the Sunshine Foundation by flying to Disney World in Florida and help push the children who are very sick and not long to live around the park.
- Entered our Corvettes in multiple shows in the communities with the biggest being the 'Corvettes for Cure' car show for children with cancer.
