2/90 – After a Rep from Meguiar's Mirror Glaze speaks at the General Membership meeting, the Gas Cap includes tips on getting professional car wash results. Nancy Simmons designs the red, white & blue – 20th Annual Cavalcade T-shirt and 29 acres across from the Corvette Assembly Plant in Bowling Green, KY are donated for the site of the National Corvette Museum.

3/90 – Another Bowling Party is held at Pike Lanes arranged by the Fellman's.

4/90 – Tim Simmons plus Sue & Joel Fellman meet with the Peterson's to revitalize CCDV's connection with Bryner Chevrolet.

5/90 – The General Membership meeting is held at Bryner Chevrolet where we are given a demonstration of the GM Diagnostic – Computer Auto Maintenance Systems (CAMS). No official Gas Cap is published – instead, just a letter was issued to inform members of upcoming events and to emphasize involvement and participation in the 20th Annual Cavalcade. Cavalcade T-shirts go on sale for \$7. (\$6. to Club members). Ray Compton, elder CCDV member, passes away at the tender age of "93"

6/90 – The 20th Annual Cavalcade is held at the Naval Air Development Center in Warminster. The main feature is Tim Delp's 1965 white coup which was recently recovered after being stolen from him in 1973! CCDV purchases its first Club storage trailer and ground breaking takes place for the NCM. 7/90 – With Club membership on the rise, the General Membership meeting is a packed house. Members attend the Feasterville July 4th Parade. New Club jackets arrive and a great group photo from the Cavalcade is offered to members at cost.

8/90 – In the Gas Cap, Ed McGinty writes about his trip to Bloomington in his '65 ragtop with his son, Pat and Bruce Waldron writes about his trip with Diane to Williamsburg, VA for the NCRS National Convention also in their '65 ragtop.

9/90 – The events: "Corvettes For Kids" in Bally, PA and CCDV Vettes at the Montgomery Commons Shopping Center were both well attended. We also take the Best Club Participation trophy at the Tri-State Corvette Assn. show at Lafferty Chev. in Warminster. Randy Riggs, Vette Magazine's Editor-in-Chief, becomes connected with CCDV and is invited to attend the Hot Dog Run. CCDV continues to join WOGL-FM in their summer "Flashback to the 50's" publicity campaign.

10/90 – Jeff Hey is praised for his new member recruitment efforts. The Hot Dog Run includes 20 CCDV Corvettes (plus 4 non-Vettes) and stops at Hot Dog Johnny's in Buttsville, NJ. (How they came up with the name of that town, I really don't want to know!) A decision is made to relocate our General Membership meetings from Giuseppi's Pizza in Richboro to Cucci's Restaurant on York Road (Rt. 263) between County Line & Street Roads in Warminster. And after 2 years, I relinquish the CCDV Presidency to Barry Jandla and become Chairman of the Board.

11/90 – The Cavalcade Awards Banquet is held on board the Spirit of Philadelphia & 25 CCDV Vettes take part in the Hatboro Parade.




