Bob Weiss' LT1 runs a 12.6 best time at 110 mph. 4/97 ** Through the efforts of Club member, Ellis Gray, CCDV begins to purchase and acquire its own high tech web site, www.CCDV.com, which meets with enormous interest from both in and outside the Club! 4/97 ** Wendell K. Strode, Executive Director of the National Corvette Museum, sends a "Thank You" letter to the Club for purchasing the 4 Club bricks, surrounded by an additional 8 bricks purchased by individual CCDV members. 4/97 ** 4 CCDV members, Wil Abney, Tom Bash, Frank Giordano and Bruce Waldron meet with members of County Corvette Association to arrange a 4 part challenge, including: auto-crossing, drag racing, softball game & road rallye, with each Club hosting 2 events. 5/97 CCDV members take part in the Willow Grove VFW Loyalty Day Parade & the Hulmeville-Penndel Memorial Day Parade - both arranged by Billie Satchell. 5/97 ** Well known Corvette auctioneer, collector and aficionado, Bob Gold, is the guest speaker at our General Membership meeting. Members also consider the possibility of changing the regular meeting place, but vote to remain at the Willow Grove VFW Post. 5/97 ** To date our web site has had nearly 600 hits (visitors), plus it was the recipient of some awards and was nominated for several others. Eric Lindros, Captain of the Philadelphia Flyers Hockey Team, leaves a (confirmed) message in our guest registry. 5/97 Bruce Waldron resigns from the CCDV Board. Ellis Gray takes over his position as Recording Secretary. Bruce remains the Cavalcade Chairman. 5/97 Joan Pollock and Anthony Cumbo join CCDV 5/97 CCDV members take part in a scavenger hunt, arranged by Dennis Trayes. 5/97 Tommy Morrison, President of Morrison Motorsports, Inc. donates his 1991 Corvette Mobil-sponsored ZR-1 race car No.92, to be displayed at the Smithsonian's National Museum of American History. This Corvette was one of the two ZR-1's Morrison entered in the International Motor Sports Association's (IMSA) 24 Hours of Daytona in 1991. The car finished 4th in the GTO Class and 11th overall at Daytona, plus 6th in class at Sebring.
- 6/97 11 CCDV members and friends caravan from the Pep Boys on Route 611 to Kansas City Prime, an exclusive restaurant, on Main Street in Manayunk suggested by Ellis Gray and arranged by Gail Abney.

- A few CCDV members attend the Car Guys Driving School at Watkins Glen Raceway, arranged by Tom Bash.
- Dave Schmidt, the automotive writer for Montgomery Publishing Co., was our guest speaker at the General membership meeting. He showed up in a black '97 C5, after testing it and putting it through its paces the prior week. A free raffle was held for members in attendance and Joel Fellman won an impressive high speed test ride with Dave at the wheel.
- A vote is held at the General Membership meeting whether to retain or abolish CECF. The vote is overwhelming to keep CECF alive!
- 6/97 Besides Bryner Chevrolet, additional Corporate sponsors for this year's Cavalcade include the Hatboro/Horsham McDonald's, Montgomery Publishing Co., West Coast Video and the Willow Grove VFW
- At the softball game, the first event in the 4 part Challenge Series with the County Corvette Club, CCDV took an early lead with 31 members attending in 27 Corvettes. We won the game 11 2! The 2nd event, autocross is scheduled for 7/13; the drag race 3rd event, is scheduled for 8/23 at Cecil County Dragway in Delaware, and the 4th and final event, the road rally is scheduled for 9/21.
- 7/97 A nice 2 page article featuring the 1997 Corvette appears on the front page of the 7/2/97 Business section of the Philadelphia Inquirer, including 2 photos & featuring CCDV member, Skip Bianchini and a statement from Club Chairman, Bob Weiss.
- 7/97 CCDV members are invited and take part in 2 July 4th parades; the Oreland Lions and Community Parade and the Bridgeport's Memorial Park and 50th Anniversary Parade.
- 7/97 35 CCDV members, family and friends caravan & spend an enjoyable day at Knoebel's Amusement Park in Elysberg, PA arranged by the Abney's.
- 7/97 Kevin Tobin, a CCDV member in the late 60's and early 70's, is our guest speaker at the General Membership meeting.
- 7/97 CCDV members caravan from the Willow Grove Pep Boys on Route 611 and take part in the Autocross, Stage 2 of the 4 part Challenge Cup 1997, with the County Corvette Association. The event takes place at Gloucester County Community College in Sewell, NJ.
- 7/97 CCDV Activities Chairperson, Billie Satchell, leads a caravan of members to attend the popular Moonlight Memories V Cruise night held on York Road in the heart of Hatboro.




