A lot has happened to Arnold Schwarzenegger since he starred in his last feature film; serving as governor California, fathering a child with his household nanny, watching the destruction of his marriage. But, the "Governator" is back and ready for action in a new high octane thriller that seems best suited as a summer release.

"The Last Stand" hits theaters tomorrow and this film directed by Jee-woon Kim is a victory for Chevrolet product placement. Every SUV has a bow tie and a cherry red Camaro is ready for its close up.

A drug cartel king (Edwardo Noriega) bolts from federal custody in Las Vegas, thanks to bad guys who orchestrate his escape by car. Since he has racing experience, his chosen method of flight to the Mexican border ushers in the real star of this film: a dark metallic gray ZR1.

The Corvette is mentioned a lot in movie publicity material and much to my delight, it gets plenty of screen time. We see shots of the car from the air, front, back and profile, weaving in and out of traffic at 170 mph plus. Lots of interior shots too. If only the soundtrack also featured the delicious exhaust note! We'll look past the tire squealing on dirt roads.

Schwarzengger plays a small border town sheriff who gave up the fast life of law enforcement in LA to sheep herd a group of fledgling cops. Only he can stop the fugitive.

There are plenty of aging references to help lower action scene expectations but fear not.

Then, there is the violence.

"The Last Stand" features plenty of "gun porn." There are Glocks, RPG's, every manner of military-assault style rifle, and a "Tommy gun." Even a Colt revolver and German Vickers machine gun find their way into the story. Heads explode and bad guys convulse as they are peppered with endless rounds.

I must admit I was a little surprised they did not tone down the violence and language to arrive at a box office friendly PG-13 rating. Instead, the orgy of blood spatter and potty mouth comes in at a hard R.

Academy Award winner Forest Whitaker plays an FBI chief. Johnny Knoxville provides comic relief as a gun museum guy.

This may be one of the best Corvette movies ever. Unfortunately, the over the top violence during a time of national gun debate makes this a guilty pleasure.

All in all, not a bad "escape."

The 1-13-13 Debut of the 2014 Stingray Glenn R. Murphy

The National Corvette Museum organized a terrific trip to Detroit for the unveiling of the C7, and we were thrilled to have the opportunity to travel with the NCM group. At 7 p.m. on January 13, 2013, the world caught its first glimpse of the C7 at the architecturally significant Russell Industrial Center, a sprawling former auto body plant and warehouse complex. Brilliant was GM's decision to debut the elegant, highly refined C7 against the backdrop of a rough, century old factory interior.

The C7 is a complete redesign over the C6, sharing only two parts with the prior model. So pleased was the Corvette Team with the ultimate design—which borrows classic Stingray elements—that GM's Vice President of Global Design, Ed Welburn determined that it indeed was worthy of the "Stingray" designation. The 2014 C7 will be available in three models, standard, Z51, and Z51 with MSR, and in three trim levels, 1LT, 2LT, and 3LT. Reportedly, the convertible model will be introduced at the Geneva Motor Show in March. GM has not yet announced any information on performance model C7's.

Engineering and design highlights of the 2014 Stingray are summarized below:

Advanced Aerodynamics: Corvette engineers used computer-aided modeling programs to predict and track air flow over, under and through the C7 body. They also used data gathered in real time from the Corvette Racing Program in the American LeMans Series. This information was used to balance front and rear grip for high-speed stability.

Lightweight: Like C6 Z06 and ZR1 models, all 2014 Corvettes will have aluminum frames. The C7 frame is 99 pounds lighter and 58% stiffer than the 2013 Grand Sport frame. Additional weight was removed from the C7 hood and roof, which are carbon-fiber on all 2014 Corvettes. This reduction in weight on high panels helps lower the C7's center of gravity. The standard, removable roof panels on all 2014 C7s will be body-color carbon-fiber. Optional roof panels are visible woven carbon-fiber and transparent. At the time of the reveal, the C7 had not yet been crash-tested so gross vehicular weight was not announced.

Engine: The 2014 C7 will have a 6.2 liter LT1 V-8, with 450 HP and 450 lb./ft. torque. It will accelerate from 0-60 in under 4.0 seconds. At this point, GM estimates the C7 will exceed the 2013 EPA rating of 26 miles per gallon on the highway. The engine will be direct-injected, have active fuel management, cylinder deactivation and continuously variable valve timing. The compression ratio is 11.5:1. The transmission choices will be a 6 speed automatic or 7 speed manual with active rev matching for downshifts during performance-oriented/spirited driving. If desired, rev matching can be toggled off. The Z51 option adds dry sump oiling to the LT1.

Interior: Upgraded materials over prior models have been selected for the C7, including better quality leather seats; carbon-fiber, aluminum and micro-suede accents; and hand-wrapped leather steering wheels. Buyers will have a choice of two seats. Standard will be the "GT" seat designed for all-around comfort and support and optional will be the "Competition Sport" seat for more aggressive support at the track. Both seats come with 8-way power and offer power lumbar, wing adjust and heating and cooling. All seats have magnesium frames for additional weight savings.

Tail Lights: The new lights are three dimensional sculpted lenses that house indirect LED lighting. The lamps are hidden and cast their light up from the bottom of the housing into a reverse reflector, creating an even glow. The tail lights integrate functional air-craft style air outlets for the available differential and transmission coolers. The inlets for those coolers can be found upper body next to the rear quarter windows.

Tires: A 2014 Corvette will be equipped with Michelin Pilot Sport ZP tires. The change in tire suppliers was in direct response to customer complaints and concerns and years of testing with the Corvette Racing Team. The wheel and tire sizes for the standard C7 are 18" front and 19" rear while the Z51 will have 19" front and 20" rear.

Other Features:

- •The C7 has electronically controlled bi-mode exhaust, which is manually switchable from the driver's seat or left fully automatic like the NPP exhaust on the C6.
- •The C7 also offers five driver selectable modes, ranging from comfort/touring to aggressive/track. There is even an ECO mode if you're so inclined to cruise and save fuel. The mode selector is on the center console.
- •The parking brake is now electronic, and the center console mounted grab handle has been eliminated. In prior models, drivers—especially those at HPDEs—lived in fear of a passenger accidentally pulling the parking brake grab handle and causing havoc.



We were awed by the 2014 Stingray and observe that photos simply do not do it justice. Although the Stingray did not make it to the Philadelphia Auto Show, it will be a short train ride away at the 113th New York International Auto Show, which runs from March 29 to April 7 at the Javits Center. And a final word on NCM-sponsored events. This trip was our first non-HPDE NCM event, and the trip was flawlessly orchestrated. In addition to being invited to the January 13 press reveal, we attended the North American International Auto Show on opening press day, enabling us to have largely unobstructed views of the cars (except for the 2014 Stingray, which was continuously surrounded by dense crowds), and we were given a great deal of access to the Corvette Team to ask questions. We strongly encourage *GasCap* readers to consider participating in NCM events.







VERSAILLES AND I

It's been called Versailles of America, the Jewel of Fhiladelphia society, Whitemarsh Hall, Stotesbury Mansion or whatever you want to call a 145 room mansion where princes and business tyccons dined and danced in the opulence of the Gatsby era. In 1921, Edward T. Stotesbury, when he was 72, built Whitemarsh Hall as a dream house for his second wife, Eva. Stotesbury lived there with his wife until his death, at age 89, in 1938.

The mansion is perched on a commanding hill in Montgomery County's Springfield township. Original acreage totaled 160, now only 47 acres remain as the single family homes abound around the beautiful old <u>ruin</u>. Yes, I said <u>ruin</u>. It looks as if it has been bombed! Vandals have reduced it to rubble - only the shell still stands. In 1921 it cost \$2 million to build and somewhere between \$3 million


In 1921 it cost \$2 million to build and somewhere Between \$3 million and \$12 million to furnish. French and English antiques, alabaster marble from Italy, Prench paintings, gold bathroom fixtures - let your imagination run wild! Annual maintenance cost was \$1 million. Well, that's not bad considering its 145 rooms with six stories - 3 underground, 45 bathrooms (all with gold plated fixtures), nine elswators, a bowling alley, a movie theatre, a babershop, squash and tennis courts, indoor swimming pool, its own powerplant, 35 indoor servants and 65 outside servants (It all adds up you know). I mean if you had a private railroad that ran to the estate, you could entertain royalty (and he did) such as the crown prince of Sweden and industrial giants. The gardens were modeled after those at Versailles, The French royal residence outside of Paris, and included pillars and fountains.

The end of Whitemarsh Hall is near. It's a shame to have to remove it. It's history. I was there in 1972. I drove right in and parked and dreamed. What a fantastic place it had to be. Stotesbury was the head of Drexel & Co., and a partner of J. P. Morgan & Co. of New York, Investment banking houses. He was the money man, the financial wizard. I stood there looking at the same things he looked at and I knew he would never be able to forsee the end of the Mansion.

My camera and my '63 Corvette have recorded another part of the history of Whitemarsh Hall. I think Mr. Stotesbury would have approved.
