8/97 The National Corvette Museum reinstitutes the previously popular new car option "R8C". With the additional payment of a \$400 administrative cost, purchasers of new Corvettes can once again take delivery at the museum. 8/97 Mike Yager, President of Mid-America Corp, purchases CERV 1, the first Chevrolet Engineering Research Vehicle, to add to his private collection. 8/97 CCDV members caravan to the annual auto-cross & drags at Englishtown, NJ, arranged by Tom Bash. 8/97 Guest speakers at the General membership Meeting includes Scott Dages from Meguiars Car Care Products and Bill Miller, co-founder and co-owner of Carlisle Productions and Fairgrounds. 8/97 CECF approves a \$500 donation to the Larry Shinoda Medical Trust Fund and the check is presented at Corvettes at Carlisle. 8/97 Members are offered to run Buy/Sell/Trade advertisements on our internet Web Site for a cost of \$10 for 3 months. 8/97 About 2 dozen CCDV members caravan and show their Vettes at the August Buxmont Car Club's Nostalgia Night to promote the upcoming Cavalcade. 8/97 CCDV members enter part 3 of the Competition Series and Challenge Cup '97 with County Corvette Association - arranged by Frank Giordano. This event takes place at Cecil County Dragway, Rising Sun, MD. The 27th Cavalcade is highlighted in the "Winners" column on the inside front cover of 8/97 the 8/29/97 - Weekend section of the Philadelphia Inquirer newspaper.

8/97 ** The 27th Annual Cavalcade of Corvettes takes place over a beautiful Labor Day weekend at the Willow Grove Naval Air Station. Gross income = \$20,800 (approx.), including \$16,000 from the gate. Expenses total \$11,100 (approx.).

The raffle car gross sales = \$32,400 - net profit, after expenses = \$13,800, of which over \$9,000 is targeted for donations! Bob Morgan of Culpsville, PA, who purchased his ticket at the Willow Grove Air Show, wins the fabulous 1990 Red Corvette raffle car.

The normal goodie bags, put together by Louann Lemek and given out to the owners of the Corvettes inside the hanger include a box of "Corvette Car Cookies", manufactured by Summerfields Corp. and officially licensed by Chevrolet. Eleven different model years are produced, including the 1986 Corvette Indy concept vehicle. Each model is shown on the package.

The Cavalcade was featured on three major television networks; including channel 3 and channel 6 on Saturday evening, plus channel 17 on Sunday.

- 9/97 A very nice photo of CCDV's web master, Ellis Gray, standing by his extremely low mileage 1978 Pace Car at the Cavalcade is printed in the 9/3/97 issue of The Intelligencer Record newspaper.
- **9/97** Evie Gibson, who now handles the Club Store, begins to take orders on Club shirts, etc., with special 40th Anniversary logos.
- 9/97 The Willow Grove Public Spirit newspaper includes a photo of Bob Weiss turning the keys of the '97 Cavalcade Raffle Car over to Bob Morgan in front of his beautiful new 1990 Red Corvette.
- **9/97** CCDV member, Jim McMillan suffers a heart attack, but comes out okay.
- 9/97 ** Club President, Mike Burke, appoints Bob Weiss to be our first Ambassador to the National Corvette Museum.
- 9/97 Steve Fisher, the head of Corvette maintenance at Bryner Chevrolet, is the guest speaker at our General Membership meeting. He provides some in depth information on the C5 Corvette.
- 9/97 CCDV members enter the 4th and final Challenge Cup event against County Corvette Assn. in a Road Rally arranged by Tom Bash and Frank Giordano. The Rally starts in the parking lot behind Wendy's at the Willow Grove Mall and ends at the Seven Stars Inn in Phoenixville, PA.
- 9/97 30+ CCDV members and family attend a Club swim party picnic and hayride at Carl & Carla Rost's beautiful home in Lahaska, PA. Carl is the New Members Committee Chairman.
- 9/97 CCDV members caravan and attend a Corvette weekend at Ocean City, Maryland, arranged by Ron Carroll.
- **10/97** Bob Houck, Jr. of H & R Radio is our guest speaker at the General Membership meeting.






