8/83 – The Trayes led "the junk food jaunt" with just 5 Corvettes (of which 1 was Don Lemek, who I believe has attended every one). The next year it became the official Hot Dog Run.

10/86 - we had just 46 members!!

9/89 – My son Brian & I were the only attendees for the Buckingham Greene's shopping center's grand opening. It started very nice but soon after, it started raining pretty heavy. When we decided to leave, Don Lemek passed by on Rt. 263 in his black '63 Vert with NO top!!! I asked him what he was doing & if he noticed it was raining. His comment: "it's only a problem when I slow down or stop!!"

7/93 – 107 CCDV members only Corvettes gather at the Bucks County Drive-In for a special photo shoot (the giant movie screen was superimposed behind our Corvettes in the fantastic photo of the event). That was our largest ever Club only Corvette gathering.

1/94 – the "Fuel Tank" was our Club's first published book – a compilation of members favorite recipes – organized by Diane Waldron with help from lots of CCDV ladies & a few guys.

11/97 – Wendell Strode – the NCM Director – was our invited guest speaker at the General Membership Meeting. We paid for his travel expenses, etc.

9/2000 – 167 members in 93 Corvettes caravan to Chip & Judy Miller's home in Carlisle, PA for a very special garage tour & bar-b-que. Our largest Corvette caravan.

10/2000 - 84 Corvettes (the most ever) go on the 16th Annual HDR

11/2000 – our membership hits 500 for the first time

2/2008 – our membership hits an all time high @ 605.

Blasting off in an American-made Rocket

A day at the Race Track in a Z51 Equipped 2014 Corvette Stingray Coupe

I was privileged to be invited by Dave and Mike Peterson of Bryner Chevrolet to test drive a C-7 at the New Jersey Motorsports Park on June 19 at a GM-sponsored event. After registering and a quick briefing of what was in store for the day, it was time to hit the track. There were Z51 Equipped 2014 Corvette coupes everywhere you looked in every color available.



On Thunderbolt's pit road were 2 queues of C7's: One line of automatic transmission cars and the other line of manuals. I chose manual, of course. The pace car was a Camaro with a GM employdriver who would lead the way, taking four C7's out behind him. After our first 20 minute session on the track, the Camaro driver approached me and said "Next session, get in the 5th car in line and you'll end up following me. I'll run as hard as you can push me" Well, that kicked up the fun level a few notches for me and let me really get the feel of this car. Since I know this track very well I was able to make a good comparison of the Z51 equipped C7 to my C6 Z06. Although the Camaro couldn't navigate the course as quickly as a Corvette I was still able to get a great feel for the car.

I did get to drive the C7 in 4, 20 minute sessions in all with the final three sessions at almost full tilt. The Camaro drivers were instructed to lift at the Start Finish line which made sense eliminating the chance of anyone heading into Turn 1 full bore and then not making the turn.

My assessment after an hour of hard driving: The Z51 C7 is an amazing machine. I put the car into Track Mode and used the Active Rev Matching feature. It handled almost as well as my Z06 and felt extremely well balanced. The brakes were very aggressive although if tracking one of these cars, I'd upgrade the brake pads. The OEM pads were fading after 15 minutes but that's to be expected from OEM grade. Surprisingly after 20 minutes of running the car between 4500-6500 RPM's the Oil Temp was only hitting 225F. The car had the optional Competition seats and they were very supportive especially during lateral G loads. The seats are a vast improvement over the stock seats. The Michelin tires were nice and tacky as well for a street tire. All in all, I'd give this car an A+.

After reading about the new generation Corvette for 16 months, it was a thrill to finally get to drive one, especially the way I like to drive my Corvette, on the Race Track. The C7 is just an amazing car and it just has to be the best bargain performance car in the world. I can't wait to own one but I am hanging on for the Z06 which is only half a year or so away.

Great job General Motors. You hit a Grand Slam with the 7th Generation Corvette.

Many thanks Dave and Mike Peterson for sending me on this mission! It was a blast.

Get Up On

They are songs that helped comprise the soundtrack of the life of boomers; "Papa's Got a Brand New Bag," "Say It Loud" and ofcourse, "I Got You (I Feel Good)." During a summer that brought us the big screen version of the story of the Frankie Valli and the Four Seasons, the amazing life and times of James Brown hits theaters.

"Get On Up" chronicles the "Godfather of Soul" with so many peaks but so many valleys too. Chadwick Boseman, who has already played the role of another African-American Icon, Jackie Robinson ("42"), channels "the hardest working man in show business" in an electrifying performance.

The movie had been in the works for years and its future was in doubt until rocker Mick Jagger stepped in as a producer. Brown and Jagger actually crossed paths several times in their careers and their first encounter in the early 60's is included in the movie.

The film begins with an incident from 1988, when Brown brandished a shotgun during an insurance seminar in Georgia and led police on a chase in his pickup truck. At the time his wife said Brown was on pain medication. The "Godfather" wound up spending some time behind bars.

The movie weaves its way through Brown's life story, starting with his bitter poverty childhood, a caring but troubled mother and a father who abandoned him. Brown's other encounter with the law (he stole a suit) as young man landed him in jail where he met a touring gospel group singer who would become a friend, providing him with a new family life. He becomes a member of a singing group that would eventually evolve into his band, "The Famous Flames." "Get On Up" also features Dan Aykroyd who plays Brown's manager who learns his high energy client will settle for no less than total control of his growing music empire.


Director Tate Taylor employs the controversial move of having his lead charactertalk to the camera at times and the story may seem a little

disjointed, but flashback sequences help to fill in the blanks. The drama is compelling but "Get On Up" is all about the music and how James Brown used his horn section to give his style its signature punch.

A memorable scene has Brown playing Boston after the assassination of Martin Luther King. Amid the angst of law enforcement with police dogs in tow, the concert comes off peacefully amid the 1968 riots and helped served as a point of healing for a reeling nation.

Boomers will find many points of historic reference in "Get On Up," a movie that should be seen by younger audiences too. It's easy to hear why Brown's music is among the most sampled by today's music talent.
