President's Message

Dear CCDV Members-

February 2014

I don't know about you, but I am beyond weary of January's snows and unseasonably frigid temperatures. Somewhat soul-warming, however, are the Board's recent discussions about the 2014 Cavalcade. Thoughts of the 2014 Cavalcade-by which time today's snow will be a distant memory-take some of the edge off of the current arctic blast.

The BIG NEWS, my fellow members, is that the 2014 Cavalcade will be held at a new location, namely Katie O'Donnell's. The decision to move the Cavalcade was neither lightly made nor without compelling justification. As you may have heard, York Road is scheduled for major reconstruction, which will begin in March 2014 and continue into 2015. The scope of the York Road project made the Cavalcade's usual venue, the Middle Bucks Institute of Technology, a suboptimal choice for this year's event.

The Cavalcade Committee evaluated several alternative locations, and it narrowed the field to three. One choice was the Warminster Community Park, and the Board authorized the Cavalcade Committee to move forward with that option. Meanwhile, Katie O'Donnell's was a potential back-up location while Committee further investigated the third option, Delaware Valley College in Doylestown. Subsequently, the Committee learned that the Warminster Community Park was not available on adjacent June dates (the planned date and a rain date) and that Delaware Valley College was not a viable location.

On behalf of Katie O'Donnell's, Ed Bonk put together a detailed proposal for the Cavalcade, and the Cavalcade committee was persuaded that Katie O'Donnell's had tremendous appeal. Among other things, the Club will save \$1000 on rent because Ed Bonk is offering Katie O'Donnell's to the Club without charge; Katie O'Donnell's is easily accessible by highway and has more than ample paved parking for participants and attendees; and Katie O's offers new amenities in the form of delicious food and beverages. Last week, the Board passed a motion to hold the Cavalcade at Katie O'Donnell's, so please mark your calendars: The 2014 Cavalcade is scheduled for June 21, 2014 (with a rain date of June 22) at Katie O'Donnell's, 4501 Woodhaven Road, Philadelphia, PA 19154.

LABOR DAY

Holidays are an ever popular movie theme and some film studios use those special occasions for titles. We've had "Valentine's Day," "Mother's Day," "Independence Day," and "Groundhog Day" among many others.

Now, director Jason Reitman ("Juno," "Thank You for Smoking") brings us "Labor Day" in the middle of winter. Go figure. Rumor is that film was initially set for Christmas release, given its cast including Kate Winslet and Josh Brolin, but held a month later out of concern that bigger films would bury it at the box office.

"Labor Day" focuses on divorced mom Adele (Winslet) and is told from the perspective of son Henry, played by talented young actor Gattlin Griffith. Henry seems older than his early teen years and has taken it upon himself to boost the spirits of his depressed other who seems to a prisoner inside their small town home. During one of her only semi regular outings to buy groceries, mother and son encounter a bloodied man named Frank, who talks his way into a trip home with the two. Turns out Frank is an escaped inmate who was serving time for murder.

After acts of kindness performed by Frank, the man on the run begins to win the trust of Adele and Henry, who aches for nuturing from a father figure. Adele's dark roots of depression are explained and we learn what led to the imprisonment who claims he has never intended to hurt anyone. How can he protect his new "friends" without them being named accomplices if he's captured?

There is romance on two fronts, involving Adele and Frank while Henry finds puppy love in the form of a girl who moved from Chicago. Plans are made to flee to Canada.

Can they pull it off?

"Labor Day" is a tale well told. While the ending may be predictable, the film will imerse you in its story and emotion. Winslet and Brolin turn in touching performances that offer reassurement there is light after darkness.



Highlights from the December 2013 Board Meeting

- At the request of the Club President because time was of the essence, an emergency e-mail vote was held on January 8, 2014 to authorize CECF to purchase a Raffle Car, and the Board approved the purchase.
- CECF purchased a 2006 Victory Red Coupe with a Cashmere interior for \$23,500.
- CECF has applied for a Raffle Permit for 2600 tickets.
- The 2014 Cavalcade has to be moved from the MBIT due to significant planned construction on York Road, which will begin in March and continue until next year. The Board approved moving the Cavalcade to the Warminster Community Park on June 28, with a Rain Date of June 29.
- Subsequent to the January 16, 2014 CCDV Board Meeting, the Cavalcade Committee learned that the Warminster Community Park location would not work because the Rain Date of June 29 was no longer available. At the request of the Club President, an emergency email motion was made to relocate the Cavalcade to Katie O'Donnell's.
- The Board approved the proposal, and the 2014 Cavalcade will be held at Katie O'Donnell's on June 21, with a Rain Date of June 22.
- The Activities Committee is working on the Activities schedule for 2014.
