President's Message

Dear CCDV Members—

March 2014

Rendered breathless was I by headlines announcing the sinkhole at the National Corvette Museum ("NCM") in Bowling Green. And when I saw the first photographs of the collapse, my heart skipped several beats. Thank goodness no one was injured in this catastrophe.

The 40 foot wide and 25-30 foot deep sinkhole, which occurred in the Museum's Skydome on February 12, swallowed eight cars: 1993 ZR-1 Spyder and the famed 2009 ZR1 "Blue Devil" (both on loan from General Motors); a 1962 Black Corvette; 1984 PPG Pace Car; 1992 White I Millionth Corvette; 1993 Ruby Red 40th Anniversary Corvette; 2001 Mallett Hammer Z06 Corvette; and a 2009 White 1.5 Millionth Corvette.

On February 27, the NCM announced the name of the restoration project and its goals:

OPERATION "CORVETTE PLUS"

We've named the project this because for something to raise from a base level 'up' equals moving in a '+' direction. Our ultimate goal is to keep the existing building 'up' in its original position, raise the Corvettes in the hole 'up', then bring the fill in the hole 'up' and lastly, bring the concrete floor back 'up' to its original level.

The NCM has not established firm timetables for the Corvette Plus project:

Since the beginning of the project, the number one goal is to 'proceed cautiously ' with the recovery and reconstruction in such a manner to keep safety of the facility and the workers the main priority and number two, plan and perform in a positive (+) direction daily. Because there are so many unknowns within the boundaries of this project, having an exact schedule 'in stone' is not practical or possible. Every day's planning and action determines the next step in executing a successful operation.

During the first week in March, the NCM hopes to begin recovering the swallowed Corvettes:

We anticipate if all plans and factors work successfully, the removal of the first three vehicles will begin during the day on Monday, in hopes to have all three cars extracted by Wednesday. The first car to be removed is the 2009 ZRI "Blue Devil." There may be some complications when removing the 1962 Black Corvette because the 5 ton concrete slab resting against the front of the car must be lifted simultaneously and in conjunction with the lifting of the vehicle.



3 Days to Kill

Movie Review by Steve Nikazy













Director McG (Joseph McGinty Nichol) brings us a story of danger and regret in the new action drama "3 Days to Kill."

Kevin Costner stars as a veteran intelligence agent/assassin (Ethan Renner) with a resume that includes global intrigue and a high body count. Ethan is in the twilight of his career. Even worse, a terminal medical diagnosis results in reflection on the family life he once had but lost.

Ethan is especially troubled he lost touch with his young daughter but his intentions of making good are complicated. A fellow spy offers him a vaccine that can extend his life in return for "one final job."

Ethan's daughter becomes a pawn as he battles bad guys and slaps around informants. Efforts to lighten the movie with comedy fall short. In one scene, Ethan "tortures" an Italian informant to provide a recipe for gravy for his daughter, who is on the phone.

There is a darker side to "3 Days to Kill" and it all comes in a hail of automatic weapon fire. Audiences are conflicted on whether to cheer for a hero who shoots people in the back and good guys who fatally plug wounded bad guys execution style.

Costner may be spared questions on the movie press tour about how he got into shape for the role. He appears puffy and unshaven in most of his scenes and can't quite pull off being an "anti hero." Acting seems secondary to the story.
