Future of the Corvette

I wonder quite often what the Corvette will look like 10 to 15 years from now. Will there be enough buyers at that time that will allow GM to continue the product line? During my travels I have time to talk to people in their early to mid twenties, I'll turn the conversation towards cars and ask them what they think of the new Corvettes? To my dismay the answer is usually the same, they think it's a nice car, but it does not interest them very much. They are more focused on the small front wheel drive cars such as Subaru, Honda, VW GTI. Although these are not my cup of tea I'll admit with add-ons such as nitrous, turbochargers, superchargers, lowered bodies they can turn a boring grocery getter into an incredible fun ride. With this in mind in 15 years when these guys are in their forties and fifties will they gravitate to these cars of their youth, or will they consider owning a Corvette? In my opinion I think they will look more to their past. I don't see them buying and restoring a 15 year old C7 any more than I would consider buying a 1952 Hudson Hornet instead of my Corvette.

If this is the future what would GM need to do to keep the Corvette name alive? I believe the future will be to give the consumer a choice. Possibly a Corvette Supercar and a Corvette Lite. The Corvette supercar would be similar to what we see today. It will still compete with the Ferrari, Lamborghini, Maserati at 25% the cost, as it does now. But the Corvette Lite could possibly fill a gap. What do I mean Corvette Lite? Imagine a Corvette the size of the two seat Pontiac Solstice (*see image*), mid engine V6 with a turbo and an affordable sticker price with the Corvette badge. This is a car I believe the car guy of today that you see in those small front wheel drives would want. Today and in 20 years Of course this is all my opinion, feel free to voice yours.

Driver opens the glove compartment: “you must be kidding me! Only my registration and insurance papers there!”

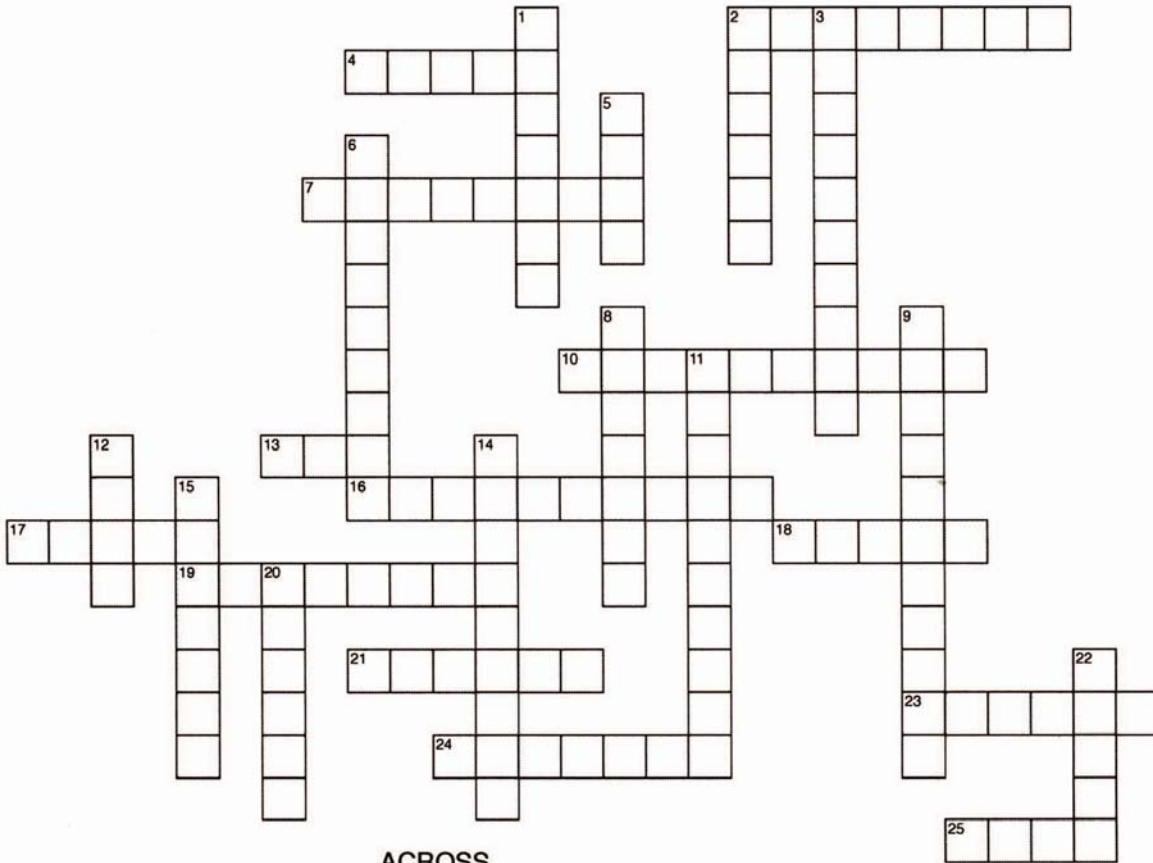
Supervisor: “Have you been drinking or engaging in any kind of drugs?”

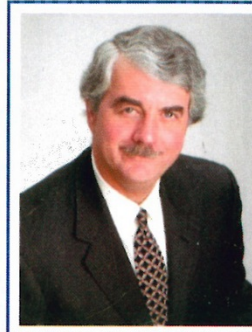
