Also, I am happy to say that we have ten club members who have signed up to be on the committee to assist in planning the event. I thank everyone for stepping forward to help make this a wonderful celebration.

Once again, the CCDV won the "Best Club Participation Award" at the Peddlers Village Show on October 1st sponsored by the Tri- State Corvette club. Hats off to our 14 members who attended. We will draw a winner from the members who attended for the \$100 swizzle stick. As you know, between transfer fees, taxes and carrying charges, the swizzle stick is worth \$10!

The CCDV Holiday Party planned for the club this year will be held on December 9th at the Hatfield Auto Museum. Please check the website for details. Barbara and Kathy have planned a fun filled night, sign up and enjoy the company of friends.

As we all know, change is difficult and sometimes hard to accept. Complacency is security, ease of mind and a normal routine. For those who read my message last month, you already have an idea of what's to come. As I stated, our membership continues to drop, income from dues continues to decrease and our overall costs continue to escalate. A decision had to be made in the best interest of the club. The Board of the Corvette Club of Delaware Valley has voted unanimously to end our relationship with the VE Club effective December 31, 2017.

We have entered into an agreement with the Ben Wilson Senior Activity Center located at 580 Delmont Avenue, Warminster, Pa. Our general club meetings will be held at this location on the second Thursday each month. The doors will open at 7:30 PM and close at 9:30 PM. There is a strict non-smoking policy at the facility. A single location at the rear of the building has been designated where smoking is permitted and will be pointed out at our first meeting. (No smoking at or around the main entrance). Feel free to bring a beverage such as coffee, tea, soda, water, juice etc. We will be discussing other beverage options with the facility later this month. There will be no food served but you are permitted to bring a sandwich, hoagie, pizza slices, etc. The only rule for bringing food and drink into the center is that we are obligated to clean up afterwards and leave the facility as we found it. We also will have corvette parking only at the center with 106 spaces available including handicap slots.

The Ben Wilson Center is located directly behind Giuseppe's Pizza & Family Restaurant. Giuseppe's is well known for good Italian food as well as a full service bar. I will be meeting with them to see if they will offer our club members a discount on food purchases on our meeting nights.

I know that this transition may not go over well with some of our members, but this decision will be a positive step for the clubs future. With the overall costs reduced, we will in turn be able to give back more to our club members during the year. The means and ways to do this will be discussed at future board meetings.

This is just a reminder, elections for the CCDV board as well as the president and his/her slate will be held at the November general membership meeting.



2018/2019 Corvette Production Plans

Well, that was quick! Rumors have been confirmed that production of the 2018 Corvette will cease early for the model year. The last date to order a 2018 Corvette is November 16, and the last week of production for the 2018 model year is the week of January 22. The 2019 model year will begin rolling off the line the week of January 29, 2018. Orders for the model start November 30. (when we need a calendar for all those dates!)

Right now, planned volume for the 2018 Corvette is just shy of 9,700 units, making it one of the shortest model years.

No major changes are coming for 2019 as models, colors and options from 2018 will carry over (sans the <u>Carbon 65 Edition</u>). Less than 100 65thAnniversary <u>Carbon Editions</u> are remaining of the 650 cap for 2018. A new order guide for 2019 will be released on November 20.

Sebring Orange (G26) can now be ordered, and a small ramp up of the new hue begins the week of December 11 (in the new paint shop, we might add).

But what about the new paint shop? Production at Bowling Green Assembly starts back up November 6, and at that time the 'basics' (Black, Arctic White, Torch Red, Corvette Racing Yellow) will begin rolling through the state-of-the-art paint shop. Tintcoats will follow the basics at a later date (Admiral Blue, Blade Silver, Cyber Matrix Gray, Long Beach Red, Sebring Orange and Watkins Glen Gray.

As for the quality of the new paint - we're told customers will not be disappointed. Some even tout the quality to be better than the crème de la crème Cadillac paint.

And as for a "C8" mid-engine Corvette, no official word has been received announcing the highly anticipated model. But it has been photographed quite a bit lately. Perhaps it's GM's way of teasing us just a little bit!


