August 9th I had the pleasure of being with Bob and Linda Lowes at the New Hope Auto Show. Our cars were side by side as were our chairs in the shade of a small tree. It was a great time to talk about their beautiful 58' Corvette and Bob's love of cars.

When Bob was 13 years old he and his friend, Fred, would walk down to Evan Chevrolet to take a peek at the new August arrivals. They would stand gazing through the fence, sun reflecting off the chrome, and right then and there it was determined Corvettes are "neat." When your only wheels are on a bicycle it's a long wait for a car and having your neighborhood border affluent Ardmore is no help. In high school there were 15 guys whose fathers bought them new Corvettes each year! When daddy's budget was being stretched, the mighty fifteen soon practiced and coined the phrase, "Beat the Dealer." Players would swap the trunk lid and hood of a 58' for ones on a 60', instantly shaving off two years and upping the trade value to unaware salesmen. While Bob's first car was not a Vette, it was a cool 1956 Chevy Belair. All black with black and white interior, dual exhaust, Continental glass packs at a \$25 savings bond price per "muffler" and for that extra sharp look he painted the inside dome light red.

1963 provided the first time behind the wheel of a Corvette. The car was brand new and owned by a friend. They were headed to work at 6:00 a.m. at Esso on City Line Ave. Bob was asked if he wanted to drive. What a thrill! He loved the split window and four speed posi. At the traffic light a 62' fuel injected pulled up and Bob's friend beside him said, "Do you want to run?" So when the light changed they were off towards the Inn of The Three Chiefs and hitting 120 mph only to have the next light turn red. Bob downshifted finally thru the gears, stood on the brakes and downshifted again while pressing so hard on the teak steering wheel he thought it would snap. He was able to stop, but the 62' blew through the light, over the hill and in perfect view of a patrol car. As Bob passed by with his window down he called out, "Have a nice day!"

The years moved on and after serving his country, Bob, married and purchased a home in February of 1971. The following September, his first wife, Norma, opened a passbook savings account entitled the "CORVETTE ACCOUNT" for \$25 as a birthday gift. It was "code" for him having permission to seek out his dream car. Just a month later, he spotted an ad in the Philadelphia Bulletin for a 58' Corvette. Earlier the owner had been on leave from the Air Force when he slid on ice, hit a fire hydrant and had to pick up the large pieces before heading back to his father's garage. It stayed there until his discharge, only being started every six months by his father. The owner hoped to sell the car for the needed \$595 gap between insurance pay out and the price of a new Nova SS.

This diamond in the rough had four bald tires, (one of which was a snow), headlights held on with bungee cords, fuzzy rugs, plenty of miles and was painted Honduras Maroon. Apparently the phone was ringing off the hook and what gave Bob the edge was he wanted to restore the car and not buy it for parts. Out they went for a test ride with the owner driving at Bob's insistence in order to carefully listen to the engine. They struck a deal and the car was held until he could return with the cash. Bob attached the plate from his 1970 Chevelle and had a friend ride his bumper on the trip back to Holland to hide the tag.

Finding time to restore was tough with two children and the gas crunch of the 70's. More years rolled on and then life flipped upside down when Norma lost her battle with cancer. With his focus now on a five and seven year old, the car remained in the garage for a total of 28 years covered with newspapers and cardboard.

In time Bob and Linda happily found one another, but 20 days following their wedding he needed a five-way bi-pass surgery. At that time the procedure was very invasive and the recovery time hard and long. Seeing Bob discouraged, Linda knew he needed something to work towards and she told him he was going to get the 58' up and running. So off it went on a flatbed for major TLC. Replacing the dry dash pad and cracked windshield revealed its original Regal Turquoise paint as did a little scratching here and there to discover more news. Bob now owned one of only 220 made in that killer color with white coves. Dupont had experimented with the color combination, but never brought it back again. Influenced by the new jet planes designer, Harley Earl, had the instrument panel placed behind the steering wheel for the very first time. This 1958 Corvette is a unique beauty and has been a lot of fun for the Lowes. A few years ago it was one of 48 representing an anniversary year in Carlisle by invitation and continues to be an eye catcher. While we sat in the shade of that small tree, many came over to remark on the color and style. It was great to watch others enjoy the car, comment and ask questions. How nice to know its history and to understand the sweetness it signifies in second chances for cars, love and life.

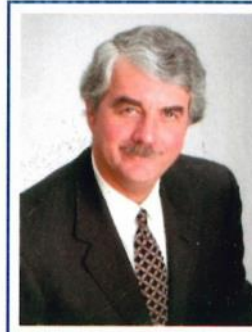
