They are looking for 20 or more Corvettes to participate in the parade that will drive selected people in the parade. It hasn't been decided but it could be a Medal of Honor recipient or a Gold Starr mother or whoever. This is another exiting moment for our club to be part of a military event. ### About the event:

The parade will fo-cus on vet-er-ans through his-tory. It will also com-mem-or-ate the 70th an-niversary of the end of World War II, the 50th An-niversary of the Viet-nam War and the 25th an-niversary of Desert Shield.

Vet-er-ans of all eras, mil-it-ary units, civic and youth groups (in-clud-ing Ju-ni-or ROTC), busi-nesses and high school march-ing bands will par-ti-cip-ate.

Any en-tity that sup-ports vet-er-ans is en-cour-aged to join the parade and Scott Brown, dir-ect-or of the Phil-adelphia Vet-er-ans Com-mis-sion is or-gan-iz-ing the event. The com-mis-sion has been seek-ing par-ti-cip-a-tion from a vari-ety of or-gan-iz-a-tions and has com-mit-ments from both the U.S. Nav-al Academy and the U.S. Mil-it-ary Academy at West Point, who will be fa-cing each oth-er in the an-nu-al Army-Navy foot-ball game in Phil-adelphia on Dec. 12.

The one-mile parade route has been set. It will start at noon at Broad and Walnut, travel north on Broad around City Hall, east on Mar-ket Street be-fore ending at In-de-pend-ence Hall.WPVI Chan-nel 6-ABC will be broad-cast-ing the event live from the start un-til it concludes around 3:00 pm.

# "BLAST FROM THE PAST"

Many of you may remember Rodger (Rod) Walton. Rod, a former CCDV Club member for many years, was recently in touch with Dick Robinson and mentioned that he had lots of old Corvette News magazines from the past plus some old CCDV Gas Caps, as well as a few NCRS Drive Line magazines, a few years of Vette Vues, a few Keepin Track magazine, etc. Dick mentioned that he should contact me as CCDV's Club Historian as maybe I'd be interested in seeing just what he had.

So towards the end of September, Rod called me and invited me to stop at his home in N/E Philly to see what his collection included. Of course I took him up on his offer. So about a week or two later I visited Rod & his wife Ann. We had a great time talking about the old days, the cars we had and the great times we had with them.

Rod & Ann previously owned Corvettes: a 1956, two 1961's, a '67 and a 1978 Silver Anniversary (license plate "25 TH"). They no longer own a Corvette but still have a gorgeous low mileage, meticulously maintained 1971 Olds Cutlass convertible and a very nice 1983 Chevy El Camino. They also have an extensive collection of (mostly Corvette) Franklin Mint's, Chevy Promo Models, and other very nice model autos all preserved in beautiful display cases.

They were cleaning house and about to throw out their magazines, Gas Caps, etc. which were kept in 4 large, heavy boxes but instead they gave them to me. It took a while to get the contents in order but the nostalgia gained by going through everything was worth it. The best part for me was reading through the old Corvette News magazines which date from 1960 through 1980!! Since those magazines published the names of most Corvette Clubs back then, including the names and addressed of the club president's, I was able to learn that some information in our Club's 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary book is close but slightly incorrect in some areas. I also found a few Mid-America catalogs from the late 70's - early 80's which gave me a good laugh when I saw the prices for parts from back then.

They also gave me a few of their extra Promo Models. They weren't looking for any money for them, but I said I would offer them to club members for a nominal price and I'd give them any cash I collected.

They were so very gracious and it was great seeing them both after so many years. Unfortunately, their age and illness prevent them from being active CCDV member. Eventually I'll list the promos they gave me. 
