BOYERTOWN MEUESUM HIGHLIGHTS



Saturday, May 22nd was Rosie the Riveter Day at the Boyertown Museum of Historic Vehicles. Not only did we see cars, trucks, wagons, carriages, and sleighs made across Pennsylvania, but we were able to watch as they commemorated the day by planting Rosie the Riveter rose bushes and listening to how important this former Boyertown Auto Works was in the war effort. Sixty-nine men were called to the war and their jobs were filled by their wives and other women. In 1939 the US Navy and Marine Corps chose this shop to design and produce front-line ambulances and mobile machine shop repair units for the war. For their effort, they received the "E" award for "outstanding production of war materials." The picture above shows the women in one of those mobile repair shops.

We saw cars made by Hines and learned the Pullman was built in York, taxis were made in Philly, and the Fairmont Park Trolley was made in 1976 for the Bicentennial, that Duryea brought his cars from New England to Reading to test his cars on the road that now holds the Duryea Hill Climb.





There is also a carriage room, complete with a blacksmithing shop, which displays items from the horse-drawn era such as an 1890 surrey made in Boyertown, an 1890 sleigh, doctors carriage, 1890 stage, and US mail wagon which left Boyertown every day at dawn carrying mail and passengers to Yellow House en route to Reading, and a water cart.

Glad we could bring back those visions from the past. What a great trip for some local history and great conversations with friends.









Join your fellow club members as we experience battle reenactments on the hallowed grounds of the Gettysburg 146 – acre Daniel Lady Farm (1008 Hanover Street, Gettysburg, PA) which borders the Gettysburg National Military Park at Benner Hill. The farm was the site of artillery placements and infantry preparations for the Confederate attack on Culp's Hill. The house and barn became a field hospital. Shell fragments and soldier's carved initials are preserved in the barn and blood-stained floors in the house.

Celebrate the 158th Anniversary of the Battle of Gettysburg with Battle Reenactments, Artillery and Cavalry Demonstrations, Living History Programs, Tours of the Restored House & Barn, and more throughout the day!

Parking is on gravel and grass so driving the Vettes is not recommended. The earlier you get there the less you have to walk from the parking area to the event site. There will be bleachers to sit and watch the main battle which happens around 3:00 pm.

John and I will be driving up Friday night July 2^{nd} , leaving from the King of Prussia Service plaza (milepost 328.4 westbound) of the PA Turnpike at 6:30 pm. If you wish to join us, meet us there. The gates open up at 8:30 am Saturday at the farm and is a 10-minute drive from the Wyndham Hotel. It is a two-hour drive from King of Prussia.

Ed Bonk will lead the others, leaving from the King of Prussia Service plaza (milepost 328.4 westbound) of the PA Turnpike at 8:00 am, Saturday morning, July 3rd.

If you want to join either group, please sign up on the website forum. There will be two listings, so we know who's going to travel when. The information for the Wyndham Hotel is below. Please make your own reservations as soon as possible to avoid the prices going up or selling out, since this event draws hundreds of people. For those who are staying over, the hotel has a full restaurant and bar. We will have breakfast at the hotel in the morning before heading home. 
