CCDY Annual Picnic





- o Verify your email address hasn't changed since joining the club. This information must stay current.
- o If you submitted a photo last year, try to submit a different photo this year.

- The Photo submission deadline is September 30th.
- Calendars should be available for purchase by early/mid November.

"OUR LAST RIDE TOGETHER"



On November 24, 1997 a new Nassau Blue Corvette became a member of our household and never could we have anticipated how significantly this car would alter our lifestyle. This Corvette entered our lives when for the first time in our marriage we could really enjoy it, when work was not all time consuming and we had more freedom to travel and enjoy life.

The year 1999 was the first 5th year anniversary of the National Corvette Museum (NCM) and we became part of the North Eastern States Corvette Caravan to the NCM. It was also our first experience of how much fun group events could be especially being surrounded by others with similar passions. If there was one highlight from this trip, and there were many, it would be following Dave McLellan, the second Corvette Chief Engineer, out of Louisville literally leading hundreds if not thousands of Corvettes down the interstate to Bowling Green, Kentucky, the home of the NCM and Corvette Assembly Plant.

In 2003, the NCM organized a tribute to the late Dale Earnhardt who was fatally injured on the last lap of the 2001 Daytona 500 NASCAR race. I was a rabid Dale #3 fan, had attended many Daytona races and witnessed Dale's crash an event that is to this day is seared in my memory. The NCM put out a request for 100 Corvettes to attend this tribute and the response was very large; hoping against hope I prayed that my request would be one of the 100. Then a letter arrived from the NCM saying yes, my Corvette was number 23 of the 100. I had to do something special to honor Dale and working with a wellknown airbrush artist an under-hood mural was created honoring Dale and the #3 Intimidator a well-known description of Dale's driving style. Time was short and the mural was completed just days before the start of the Corvette Legends Tour in North Carolina at Dale's Race Shop. The first time anyone from the public saw the mural was when I opened the hood in front of the main entrance to DEI, the Dale Earnhardt Incorporated race shop. I was honored that so many of the DEI's employees came out to view this tribute to Dale.



By this time, I had obtained a number of historical signatures on the car from the icons of Corvette history a number that would eventually grow to 24 signatures many that are irreplaceable. Among the signatures are Jim Perkins General Manager of the Chevrolet Division who secretly funded at great risk to himself the development of the C-5 and Elfi Arkus-Duntov the wife of Corvette's legendary first Chief Engineer Zora Arkus-Duntov. Also, all the original drivers of the C5-R race cars when Corvette returned to active international competition have signed this Corvette. Of the 24 signatures, 16 are already members of the Corvette Hall of Fame and recognized in the rotunda at the National Corvette Museum.



In 2004 I was asked by a local Corvette Club, the Skyline Drive Corvette Club, if I would consider assuming the position of Club Ambassador to the NCM and I immediately accepted this position. I held the Club Ambassador's position for the next twelve years. Of course, this responsibility obligated me to attending Ambassador's meetings in Bowling Green and the '98 made many more trips to the NCM. When I went through my personal scrap books of all that we had done with this car, I counted 14 trips to the NCM. It would be safe to say that this one owner C-5 and the NCM their histories are intertwined.

The '98 was our "go to" Corvette for the next 10 years including quite a few trips to Florida in the

wintertime. We visited Key Largo, Key West more than once, Sanibel and Captiva Islands to name a few destinations and the '98 was always in the lead of a Corvette caravan. The '98 toured New England, Indiana, Ohio, Virginia, Tennessee, and oh so many other States and almost always at the head of a line of Corvettes. The thrill of seeing those Corvettes in the rear-view mirror made all the planning worth the effort. There is even a paver near to the entrance to the NCM at Bowling Green that says: "Leader of the Pack from the Gang".

Even after other Corvettes joined our household, the 2008 followed by the 2014, we often took the 1998 on trips the last one taking place in 2019 to upstate New York. I never tired of driving her, that old shoe that always feels so comfortable. When our 50th wedding anniversary arrived in 2019, Dor asked what Corvette are we taking for our special dinner together. No need to guess! It was our beloved '98 that held so many memories over the preceding twenty-two years of our married life together.

I approached the NCM early in 2021 to ascertain if they would be interested in obtaining this amazingly documented one-owner 1998 coupe, an original one of the 100 Dale Earnhardt Legends Tour Corvettes The answer from the NCM's Collections Review Committee was almost immediate; "Yes, we want that 1998 Corvette". So, the die was cast, the car would go to the NCM. The car had to be professionally appraised and the appraiser stated: "this is the most documented car he had ever seen". There were twelve loose leaf binders of the photographs, the handwritten notes, all the car show entry forms and maintenance records. Everything that was just part of the documentation followed this Corvette to the NCM. Included was the original 1998 Chevrolet Corvette poster that hung on the dealer's showroom wall in 1997 - 1998 and that the salesman had saved for me.



Our last ride together those 800 miles to the NCM were bittersweet; she ran as good as day one some 23 years and four months earlier when we first became acquainted. Well maintained, yes, and she never let us down no matter what the conditions were including record snow returning from Florida and driving home from Bowling Green in the heaviest rains ever recorded when almost every road was flooded and all I could see was to follow the top lights on a big 18-wheeler. I had that much confidence in my '98 C-5. And can we ever forget the pure joy of driving down the Florida Keys to Key West with the transparent top in place looking at the beautiful blue sky and fluffy clouds with the air conditioner on and the windows down - scenes like that are never forgotten.

Goodbye old friend you will never be forgotten; you were so much a part of our life and for so many others certainly all those in the rear-view mirror for all those tens of thousands of miles of adventures and comradery.

But why is there this hollow feeling in my stomach like the loss of a cherished furry friend that has been a part of your household for a long time? I guess that comes with any parting. I know our cherished 1998 C-5 is in the correct location, the National Corvette Museum, and hopefully many others can view this special Corvette and maybe understand what Corvette and the NCM means to us.

Our license plate said it all: 10NR-98.

- 1. 1988 CORVETTE DEALER'S POSTER. This poster hung in the dealer when I purchased the 1988 Corvette that was donated to the NCM in 2010. I could not part with the framed poster then; I needed something to remember our 1988 in my den. But it is now the time to donate it to the NCM.
- 2. 1998 CORVETTE DEALER'S POSTER: This poster hung in the dealer when I ordered the 1998 Corvette on September 15th 1997. I requested that he save it for me and true to the salesman's word he gave it to me at the end of the model year. It was also professionally framed.
- 3. The donated 1998 was signed by 24 Corvette significant men and women during its' 24-year history in my possession. The historic signatures have been tabulated and are listed in a framed list of *who's who* in the history of this Corvette. Many, actually most signers are in the NCM Hall of Fame.
- 4. 2003 DALE EARNHARDT CORVETTE AMERICAN LEGENDS TOUR. This Corvette was number 23 of the 100 Corvettes chosen by the NCM to pay tribute to the late Dale Earnhardt at his race shop, DEI, Inc in North Carolina April 24-26, 2003. A synopsis of this "once- in- a lifetime" event was professional created and framed.

The Hood Blanket Mural is outstanding tribute to USA and Corvette". Wil's words are framed along with a photograph of the 1998 that the NCM used in the NCM's May, 2018 calendar. The award was presented May 19-21, 2006 during the Corvette Corral activities at the race.
- 7. THE NCM'S WILL COOKSEY CHOICE AWARD. This plaque awarded to the 1998 and was personally autographed by Wil Cooksey.
- 8. THE ORIGINAL 1998 CORVETTE WINDOW STICKER. The first window sticker was folded during the dealer's preparation of the car prior to my arrival to take possession of the car. Somehow the salesman got me a perfect untouched window sticker from the factory and that is the one that was framed. The folded window sticker that was on the windshield is in Volume #1 of the records of this 1998 Corvette.


