Now guess what time it is? You guessed right – it's PS time:

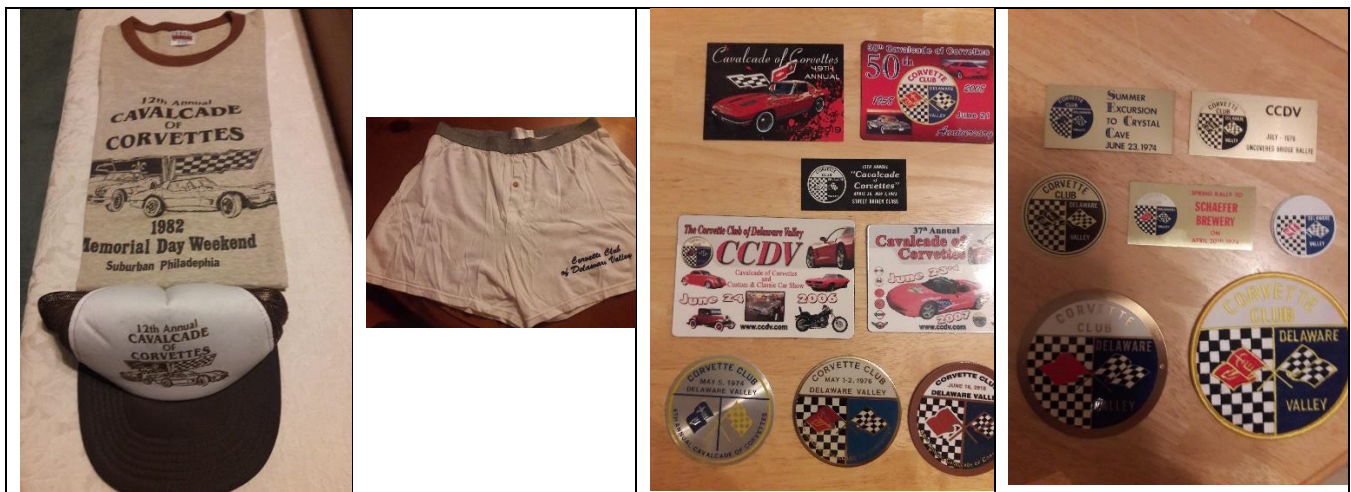

UNCORKED CORVETTE- BASE C-7 460HP CAN A 20 MINUTE ADD-ON ADD 21 HP AND 21 FOOT-POUNDS OF TORQUE?

Those words in a recent article in Vette Magazine about the installation of an after-market cold-air induction system caught my attention. The article based its figures on dyno results and I thought it was worth investigating. I made a trip to Injection Connection over in Horsham; if anyone should know it would be Dale Cherry, owner and well known for his expertise in the sophisticated art of modern computer super tuning. I showed Dale a copy of the article and we agreed on a plan: let's see if the claims are valid by doing a base-line dyno on my stock 2014 Z-51 460 HP, then install Holley Performance Products new iNTECH cold-air intake system, and n repeat the dyno test.

On a perfect day for the test, July 1st 40% humidity and 80 degrees F my 2014 was attached to Dale's dyno for the base line dyno results-and they were quite good showing 451 HP and 471 ft.-pounds of torque at the rear wheels-not bad for a base bone stock motor. After a short period to let the motor cool, the Holley cold-air intake was installed in about 20 minutes. Now we shall see if the results in Vette Magazine obtained on Holley's dyno in Bowling Green, Kentucky are really

accurate. The first dyno pull was somewhat disappointing showing only a 5 HP gain however the fuel/air ratio was showing a lean condition indicating that the new system was indeed flowing more air. The note of caution in the Holley installation guide came to mind: “Power gains may not be immediate, multiple key cycles may be needed for the vehicle to register optimum gains.” In other words, the computer has to adjust to the increased air flow. So, a second dyno pull was done and indeed the results got better, more HP and torque.

Now let’s try again but first give some time for the motor to cool down and two fans did the trick. After about 10 minutes a third dyno pull was done and the results were amazing showing over a 20HP and 20 ft-pound gain over the whole curve all the way to 6,400 rpm our max rpm limit for the test. The article was accurate and the system works as advertised. The Holley cold-air induction system looks stock, fitted perfectly and installed in just 20 minutes. Thanks to the boys at Injection Connection for working with me. The dyno does not lie, the gains were impressive and all in less than 20 minutes.

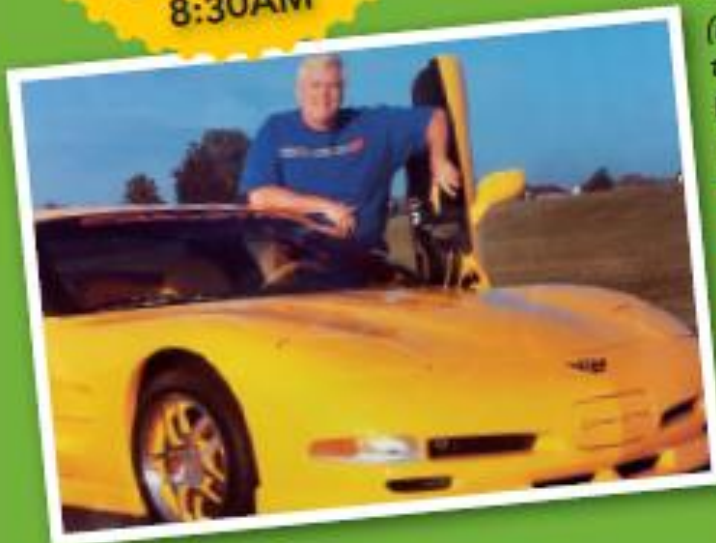
