In 1978 at least with the Corvette’s Silver Anniversary and fast back coup design (last seen in the 1967 Coupe), once again owners had the ability to actually pack more than a lunchbox in that huge rear hatch area.

On more than one caravan with the Club, we actually had our young son and his best friend sit in

In 1984, with the arrival of the world class C4, came a totally redesigned new look with digital electronics galore, top notch handling capabilities including tires that at the time looked like racing slicks to those of us who were used to skinny 60’s or 70’s series. Since there was no official 1983 Corvette produced, the total sales of the 1984 C4 more than doubled the number of 1982.

And now we're awaiting the entrance of without a doubt, the most advanced, long hyped and altered Corvette expected to be available with a mid-engine design. And so, I regress and state once again: **"for the times they are a changin'."**

### FUN FACTS ABOUT CORVETTES FROM A GENERAL MOTORS BLOG:

1. One of the most widely regarded as the most beautiful and influential Corvettes ever made is the 1963 C2 Stingray, Split-Window Coupe. This was the first year that the coupe was available. Only 278 left the St. Louis production line with the air-conditioning option. The split-window model only existed for one year due to a disagreement between two designers, Bill Mitchell and Zora Arkus-Duntov.
2. The highest production year for the Corvette was 1979 when 53,807 units were produced.
3. The last remaining 1983 model Corvette known to exist is on display at the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky. Apparently, there were quality issues that caused General Motors to stop its production to solve the problems and by the time corrections were made, it was introduced as the 1984 model.

Thank you very much for your donation in the amount of \$950 on 12/31/2018 (receipt #19750637). We couldn't do this important work without the help of compassionate animal lovers like you.

We are grateful for your generous ongoing support for the animals. Demand for our services is on the rise. Our team of humane officers has investigated 574 complaints of animal cruelty and neglect, a 32% increase from last year. These investigations resulted in the rescue of 185 animals (45 more than last year) including cows, pigs, dogs, cats and small animals. Many of these animals are in our care for months while we work to win custody, heal their wounds, and enrich their lives until they can be placed for adoption.

Our shelter medicine team performed more than 600 subsidized cat sterilizations to help economically-stressed cat owners prevent unwanted litters. This is huge progress in our long-term effort to bring Bucks County's outdoor cat population under control, and a milestone we would not have been able to achieve without the help of community members like you.
