MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT JULY 2019

Frowing up in the mid-60's and starting to drive I eventually moved away from dad's '61 White Ford Galaxy with the mighty 390. My friends also had some pretty interesting rides.

<u>Neal</u> had a sharp '69 Blue AMC Javelin with the 290. His parents always had AMCs and in-fact I took my driver's test in their '65 American because it was considerably smaller than my dad's Ford.

<u>Steve G.</u> was always a very different kinda guy and not surprising, he drove a '63 Gold Avanti'. It was a sharp auto and may have somewhat caused me to get interested in high performance sports cars.

<u>Dennis</u> drove a Black '67 Olds Starfire with a hefty 394. We travelled quite a bit in his Olds.

<u>Jay</u> drove a plain Jane Blue '70 Olds Cutlass with a 350 and <u>Mark</u> drove an older White MG which was also a fun car, especially when we would try to pile 4 of us in for a ride. At least Steve's Avanti' had an actual but small back seat!

<u>Steve S</u>. had many cars as his dad owned a used car lot. But most especially, I remember his 1966 Sinister Black S-55 Merc with a 428. I remember barreling up Rt. 95, his speedo topping out above 120 and me being scared to death! That huge car had a ton of power but weighed 2 tons! Steve S. is also the car mechanic who never had any loot and yet somehow acquired the '57 Plymouth Fury and the '58 Chevy Belair I financed and drove after he managed to get them roadworthy. Then after a few months, I'd sell them and share half the profit with Steve.

<u>Charlie</u> drove a really sharp Yellow '70 Dodge RT with the 440. That was a great car (once he replaced the dual quads with a single big Holley). That car moved me to buy my '72 'Cuda 340.

I loved my 'Cuda but it got me into plenty of trouble with the local cops and eventually into racing at Atco. At one point the trans went and a shop in Philly's Mayfair section did a rebuild, added a shift kit and scared me when the owner took me for a test ride. Until then, I had no idea that trans work could literally "Transform" my 'Cuda into an awesome street race monster and a contender mostly at Front & Delaware Avenues!

Moving ahead 4 years and while dating Sue, along came Mr. "Yellow Coupe". After the first 30 or so years being mostly stock, after joining the Corvette Challenge at E-Town through the CCDV membership, that's when the mods started: first came the Aluminum Heads w/Roller Rockers ZZ4 which immediately doubled the HP and along with the trans kit & new 355 rear plus desperately needed performance brakes, dual electric fans, the '69 factory side-pipes, Cragers (and I shouldn't forget the outlawed spinners), new fiberglass bumpers and a high rise hood, the Vette was ready. And so became our transformed "Yellow Monster", especially once the Sniper Nitrous Oxide kit was added.
