Back in 2004, our dream of helping at-risk youth through outdoor learning experiences became a reality with the first YOE trip. In the fifteen years since then, we have adapted the program and helped hundreds of youth develop self-esteem, learn collaborative problem solving and conflict resolution skills and other abilities that will serve them throughout their lifetimes.

Knowing that the intervention we provide over three weeks in the summer is powerful, we are exploring ways to create that experience for youth year-round. 


