


# 2023 CCDV CALENDARS

Here are some **Rules of Thumb** for your photos:

- o Include your complete name & year of Corvette (ie: John Smith 1992 LT-1).
- Be aware of the **background** in your photo (try to exclude trash cans, poles, vehicles, fences, random people, parking lots lines, large shadows, etc).
- Don't point your camera towards the sun (best to have the sun at your side).
- o Watch for excessive sun glare on your windshield or chrome.
- Keep windows down to prevent reflection or glare
- A "closed hood" looks better & requires less print space than an "open hood" photo.
- o If you submitted a photo last year, try to submit a different photo this year.
- Verify your email address hasn't changed since joining the club. This information must stay current.
- Email 1 or 2 of your favorite photos to: webmaster@ccdv.com
- Photo submittal deadline is September 30th.
- Calendars should be available for purchase by mid November.

Congratulations to all the winners.



# NATIONAL CORVETTE MUSEUM – "THE BASH"

#### APRIL 28-30, 2022

The Bash is the opening event at the National Corvette Museum each year and is focused on "what is new" with Corvette and is keynoted by the Corvette marketing, engineering and manufacturing teams. Each team gives seminars or demonstrations on



all that is going on with the Corvette and of course this year's focus was on the new Z-06 high performance model scheduled for production later this year. So much is new and the engineering so outstanding that I could never detail here what we saw and heard. However, if you are interested the seminars can be found on YouTube but believe me the sound of a 2023 Z-06 starting up is awesome even across the parking lot.

The whole Bash event is filled with activities including a good number of road tours lead by the NCM, a live and silent auction of Corvette items



past and present, a special classroom on the C-8 hosted by Paul Koerner recognized as the GM Corvette specialist (preregistration required) and both Michelin Tire and Mobil 1
Oil technical updates. Yes, believe me that
the summer tires on my new Z-51 are far
improved of those that came on our Z-51
2014 and that was verified by the Michelin
engineers upon my questioning. Technology
never rests nor does



improvement in design. From the Museum's car collection demonstration drives of older Z-06's and the iconic '63 Split window were something to see and hear. Actually, this synopsis is only a portion of all that was available for us attendees including two banquets at the NCM on Thursday and Friday evenings.

My Corvette group to the Bash totaled 16 Corvettes in what Dor and I refer to as "our Corvette extended family" and many of us have been traveling together on NCM events for years if not decades. Our group had cars from Eastern Pennsylvania, of course, but

Corvettes from our area and the others joining us in Bowling Green at our favorite hotel. The lobby echoed with the sounds of familiar voices every

evening not only from our group but friends from other Corvette Clubs that we have gotten to know so well over the years. The NCM is indeed a focal point for all things Corvette especially the people. For Dor and I, it was our first extended road trip in our new 2022 Z-51 Corvette and that is another story in "how to pack" and to experience extremes of weather from very warm to cold with very heavy rain. The new C-8 handled it all without a whimper, was a

delight as the caravan lead, and felt great on the solo 800 mile trip home straight through. One thing is for sure, gas mileage definitely improves with break-in miles.

# **GLOVEBOX**

Recently I reached into my 2008 C6 thru the open passenger side window to get the insurance papers needed to fill out the required State Registration Form, a simple act that I had done many times over the years. Surprise when the plastic latch handle snapped off and the glove box was still closed with no way to open it. Yes, I tried using a small screwdriver, ice pick, then a larger screwdriver and finally some days later used brute force, get my fingers behind the door on both sides of the latch and yank hard—it worked and the locking mechanism also plastic except for the tumbler shattered. I cut a piece of wood and used that to wedge the door shut so the light would go out. The actual latch mechanism is held in place with two small torx screws only accessible from the inside of the glove box. What now?



Well, a trip to Bryner and a chat with Steve" *our master Corvette guru*" and surprise I am not the only C6 owner who has experienced this problem and the replacement latch is available, but a word from Steve to be careful with inserting the tumbler into the latch mechanism,



it only goes one way. Well," with less than good close vision" a second trip to Bryner and Steve carefully inserts the tumbler mechanism, amazing how easy it is when you know what you are doing. Even better, Steve lets me borrow a miniature torx ratchet that made the job of attaching the new latch into the glove box door so easy. The original latch was cashmere in color but the new one is black and as my good passenger said, "who cares"! Actually, we like it better.

First of all I would like that thank the people at Bryner for helping me solve a somewhat unorthodox problem. How many repair facilities would give you detailed instructions, help with replacement parts and even give you a special tool to aid in reassembly? Believe me, I do appreciate all that was done to solve this problem.

And from now on I would suggest to all C6 owners: push lightly on the glove box door before pulling the latch handle to reduce stress on the mechanism. No more reaching in the window to open the glove box, it isn't worth it.




