TRANSPARENT REMOVEABLE ROOF PANELS FOR C-7 AND C-8 CORVETTES

September 2022

TRANSPARENT REMOVABLE ROOF PANEL for C-7 AND C-8 CORVETTES

Going all the way back to my C-4 days, and through the C-5, C-6, C-7 and now the C-8 Corvette, I have always liked the dual roof option of having an opaque top for the summer months but having the added interior light and visibility offered by a transparent roof panel in the Fall, Winter and Spring months. There is nothing better than autumn in New England or the Florida Keys in February as seen through a transparent roof panel.

The design of the C-4, C-5 and C-6 with the B-pillar hallo going across the car made the transparent top seem esthetic and a part of the car — not an afterthought. However, starting with C-7 and now C-8 the transparent roof panel looked unfinished as if the transparent top was an afterthought. Chevy must have had a similar observation as the optional visible carbon fiber roof panel came from the factory with a "body-colored surround" — the exact words on the order form. Is it possible to paint the transparent top so that it looks identical to the factory painted carbon fiber panel? The answer is "Yes", it can be done!



My first effort at painting the surround on a transparent top came soon after I took delivery of our white 2014 coupe with the dual roof option that being the carbon fiber panel with the body-colored surround and the transparent panel.

No, I did not do the painting, but knew from previous unfortunate experiences of a noted Corvette body shop, now out of business, to perform the surround painting on my 2014 transparent roof panel. The photograph shows this panel painted white in 2014 and still in perfect condition seven years later and with many, many thousands of miles of exposure to the elements. Experience and being 'willing to try' makes things happen.

I knew from the first time I put the transparent top on the new C-8 and how it looked so unfinished - like hanging in space - which I had to correct the situation and make it look like the carbon fiber roof panel with the factory painted surround. From recommendations of other Corvette enthusiasts, I approached the John McShane Auto Body Shop in Southampton, Pennsylvania and spoke directly to John McShane. After our first meeting I knew I had the right person for the project. A number of test pieces were made to make absolutely sure that the color was a perfect match and then the transparent roof panel surrounds both sides were painted by John's master painter.

The process requires five steps not including consultations with the paint vendors, and here is what was done:

- 1. Mask off and scuff the areas to be painted
- 2. Apply an adhesion promoter
- 3. Apply a sealer and allow for an adequate curing time (for my top, overnight cure)
- 4. Apply the Red Mist Base Coat
- 5. Finally apply the finish clear coat



The end result was a perfect match and Red Mist is an optional Corvette color that is indeed a challenge, and the test panels were worth the effort. That was evident in the final color match to the factory paint job. Perfect match! Way to go pros.

With the transparent top installed the

whole interior of the C-8 is so much brighter and it also adds to a feeling of more interior room and of course you can see everything overhead like those beautiful white fluffy

clouds floating on a dark blue sky. I will from previously experience keep the transparent top on from September to early May and only use the carbon fiber opaque top during the summer and those times of intense summer sun. And it is so rewarding that the painted transparent top looks almost identical to the very expensive factory painted carbon fiber roof panel except when viewed looking down being inches away from the top. I sincerely believe that almost no one will ever know which top is on the car, not that it matters anyway.

John McShane and his staff did a perfect job, actually two tops were done the other from another CCDV club member also Red Mist, and at all times we were kept informed and the end result is exactly as I hoped it would be.


